A Concurrent Resolution praising the law enforcement career of Dr. Jeanie Nelson; wishing her well upon the occasion of her retirement as Director of CLEET; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, the Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training (CLEET), located in Ada, Oklahoma, is a state agency with 43 full-time employees. The agency's mission is to "provide basic and continuing education and training for Oklahoma peace officers and to license and regulate the private security industry." The agency is governed by a 13-member Council. Established in 1963, CLEET supports Oklahoma law enforcement in serving its communities; and

WHEREAS, Jeanie Nelson began her state career with the Department of Human Services (DHS) as an investigator and supervisor in the Child Abuse and Neglect Unit. During her seven years at DHS, she was assigned to CLEET as a part-time instructor. In 1980 Jeanie Nelson transferred to CLEET as a full-time instructor in child abuse investigation, domestic violence, interpersonal communications and juvenile law. She was promoted to Training Division Supervisor and then in 1988 to Manager of the Standards Division. Jeanie Nelson was appointed CLEET's Assistant Director in 1995 and Director on April 19, 1997. With the appointment, Oklahoma became the first state in the nation to appoint a female as director of a peace officer standards and training (POST) agency; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Jeanie Nelson has a Bachelor of Arts degree in Psychology from the University of Central Oklahoma in Edmond and a Masters in Social Work and a Doctorate in Adult and Community Education from the University of Oklahoma in Norman. Dr. Nelson has held the position of Adjunct Instructor within the Criminal Justice Division of the University of Central Oklahoma; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Jeanie Nelson has served as Secretary for, and is a member of, the International Association of Directors of Law Enforcement Standards and Training. She is also an active member of the Oklahoma Sheriffs and Peace Officers Association, the Oklahoma Association of Chiefs of Police, the Oklahoma Sheriffs' Association, and the International Association of Chiefs of Police. She also served on the Oklahoma Board of Tests; and

WHEREAS, in 2006 CLEET moved to its new facility, the K.O. Rayburn Training Center in Ada. The facility, representing the completion of a dream by Dr. Nelson and previous CLEET Directors, is a state-of-the-art complex and is one of the finest law enforcement training facilities in the entire country; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Jeanie Nelson will be retiring as Director of CLEET after 34 years of state service, ten of them as Director of CLEET.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 51ST OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

THAT the Oklahoma State Legislature praises the law enforcement career of Dr. Jeanie Nelson, an individual who rose through the ranks possessing a strong sense of professionalism, a willingness to work with others, and respect for formal education.

THAT the Oklahoma State Legislature wishes Dr. Jeanie Nelson the best upon the occasion of her retirement as Director of CLEET.
