A Concurrent Resolution commending the Susan G. Komen
for the Cure Affiliates for their dedication in
fighting breast cancer; proclaiming May 7, 2008,
"Komen Advocacy Day" at the Oklahoma State Capitol;
and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, the Susan G. Komen story is about a promise between two
sisters and a horrible disease. When Susan G. Komen was diagnosed
with breast cancer, her sister Nancy Brinker was there to help and
support her. Nancy had her left breast biopsied three separate
times with no malignancy found. The two sisters compared notes on
how bleak the medical environment was and how lonely and uninformed
both the patients and their friends and family were. The sisters
promised each other that they would improve the situation; and

WHEREAS, after a three-year struggle that included nine
operations and three courses of chemotherapy and radiation, Susan G.
Komen, at the age of 36 years, was killed by breast cancer. Her
sister Nancy was left to fulfill their mutual promise to each other;
and

WHEREAS, Susan G. Komen for the Cure is the most progressive grassroots organization fighting breast cancer today. With more than 100,000 survivors and activists in 125 cities and communities and three international Affiliates, the Komen Affiliate Network is the nation's largest private funder of community-based breast health education and breast cancer screening and treatment programs. Up to three-fourths of the net income from each Komen domestic Affiliate is dedicated to fighting breast cancer in that Affiliate's community. Every year, Komen Affiliates award grants to local hospitals and community organizations that provide breast health education and breast cancer screening and treatment programs for medically underserved women. The remaining Affiliate income supports the Komen Award and Research Grant Program, which funds groundbreaking breast cancer research, meritorious awards and educational and scientific programs around the world.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 51ST OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

THAT the Oklahoma State Legislature commends the Susan G. Komen for the Cure Affiliates for their dedication to fighting breast cancer.

THAT the Oklahoma State Legislature proclaims May 7, 2008, "Komen Advocacy Day" at the Oklahoma State Capitol.

THAT a copy of this resolution be distributed to the Central Oklahoma Affiliate and the Tulsa Affiliate of Susan G. Komen for the Cure.
