A Resolution expressing gratitude to Senator Jeff Rabon for his service in the Oklahoma State Senate; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, Senator Jeff Rabon is completing his twelfth year of service to the citizens of District 5 in the Oklahoma State Senate; and

WHEREAS, Jeff Rabon was born in Durant, Oklahoma, on May 18, 1962. He graduated from Hugo High School and earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Public Relations/Journalism from Oklahoma State University. A business executive, Jeff Rabon is Central Regional Manager of the Choctaw Management Services Enterprise and continues to work as a licensed real estate broker-agent/appraiser. He began his career in public service as a field representative for United States Senator David Boren, Co-Campaign Manager and Special

Assistant for Congressman Bill Brewster, Legislative Liaison for the National Rifle Association (NRA), and Senior Administrative Assistant for Lieutenant Governor Jack Mildren. He is married to Dana Bates Rabon, and they have three children – Jeff II, Berrie Shannon, and Jackson Thomas; and

WHEREAS, Jeff Rabon has been a member of the Oklahoma State Senate since 1996. Senator Rabon has served as a member of the Executive Committee of the Southern States Energy Board and currently serves as Assistant Co-Floor Leader of the Oklahoma State Senate; and

WHEREAS, State Question No. 632, adopted September 18, 1990, and effective January 1, 1991, limits the length of service for a member of the Legislature to a total of twelve years, and as a result, Senator Rabon will not be eligible to stand for reelection this year; and

WHEREAS, Jeff Rabon's energy, persistence and resolute advocacy will not soon be equaled. His unwavering support of Native Americans, rural economic improvement, and Oklahoma tourism and transportation has benefited Oklahomans far beyond the borders of his southeastern Oklahoma district.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 51ST OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:
