9 AS INTRODUCED

10 An Act relating to the Ethics Commission; making an  
11 appropriation; stating purpose; requiring budgeting  
12 in certain categories and amounts; providing for  
13 duties and compensation of employees; providing  
14 budgetary limitations; providing lapse dates;  
15 requiring certain budget procedures; providing an  
16 effective date; and declaring an emergency.

17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

18 SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to the Ethics  
19 Commission from any monies not otherwise appropriated from the  
20 General Revenue Fund of the State Treasury for the fiscal year  
21 ending June 30, 2009, the sum of \_\_\_\_\_ Dollars (\$0.00) or so much  
22 thereof as may be necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the  
23 Ethics Commission by law.

1 SECTION 2. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2009, the Ethics  
2 Commission shall budget all funds in the following categories and  
3 amounts:

10 SECTION 3. The duties and compensation of employees, not  
11 otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed  
12 upon the Ethics Commission by law shall be set by the Executive  
13 Director. The Ethics Commission for the fiscal year ending June 30,  
14 2009, shall be subject to the following budgetary limitations on  
15 full-time-equivalent employees and expenditures excluding  
16 expenditures for capital and special projects, except as may be  
17 authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of  
18 the Oklahoma Statutes:

22 SECTION 4. Appropriations made by this act, not including  
23 appropriations made for capital outlay purposes, may be budgeted for  
24 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2009 (hereafter FY-09) or may be

1 budgeted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010 (hereafter FY-10).  
2 Funds budgeted for FY-09 may be encumbered only through June 30,  
3 2009, and must be expended by November 15, 2009. Any funds  
4 remaining after November 15, 2009, and not budgeted for FY-10, shall  
5 lapse to the credit of the proper fund for the then current fiscal  
6 year. Funds budgeted for FY-10 may be encumbered only through June  
7 30, 2010. Any funds remaining after November 15, 2010, shall lapse  
8 to the credit of the proper fund for the then current fiscal year.  
9 These appropriations may not be budgeted in both fiscal years  
10 simultaneously. Funds budgeted in FY-09, and not required to pay  
11 obligations for that fiscal year, may be budgeted for FY-10, after  
12 the agency to which the funds have been appropriated has prepared  
13 and submitted a budget work program revision removing these funds  
14 from the FY-09 budget work program and after such revision has been  
15 approved by the Office of State Finance.

16 SECTION 5. This act shall become effective July 1, 2008.

17 SECTION 6. It being immediately necessary for the preservation  
18 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby  
19 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and  
20 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
