6 AS INTRODUCED

7 A Concurrent Resolution recognizing Creek County's  
8 efforts in commemorating the spirit of Route 66; and  
9 directing distribution.

11 WHEREAS, Route 66, the famous American highway, was established  
12 in 1926; and

13 WHEREAS, Route 66 traveled through eight states, beginning in  
14 Illinois and ending in California; and

15 WHEREAS, it is recognized that the State of Oklahoma has more  
16 surviving miles of Route 66 than any other state; and

17 WHEREAS, many individuals and organizations within the State of  
18 Oklahoma use their special talents, skills, and resources in order  
19 to celebrate, preserve, and explore this American phenomenon; and

20 WHEREAS, it is recognized that Creek County uniquely celebrates  
21 the spirit of Route 66 each year by holding the Route 66 Blowout and  
22 Car Show in downtown Sapulpa, drawing numerous participants and  
23 thousands of happy spectators, and the Creek County Sheriff Reserve  
24 Deputies Route 66 Car Show at the Creek County fairgrounds, both of

1 which celebrate the classic automobiles that have traversed the  
2 Mother Road.

3 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES  
4 OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 51ST OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE SENATE  
5 CONCURRING THEREIN:

6 THAT the Oklahoma State Legislature hereby recognizes Creek  
7 County's efforts in commemorating the spirit of Route 66 each year  
8 by holding the Route 66 Blowout and Car Show in downtown Sapulpa,  
9 and the Creek County Sheriff Reserve Deputies Route 66 Car Show at  
10 the Creek County Fairgrounds.

11 THAT the Oklahoma State Legislature declares that Creek County  
12 be recognized as the State of Oklahoma's "Route 66 Car Show  
13 Capital", and urges all Oklahomans to come and enjoy the outstanding  
14 car shows.

15 THAT an official copy of this resolution be distributed to the  
16 Mayor of Sapulpa, Oklahoma, the Mayor of Kellyville, Oklahoma, and  
17 the Mayor of Bristow, Oklahoma.
