ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 128 - By: MYERS of the Senate and LUTTRELL of the House.

An Act relating to technology center schools; amending 70 O.S. 2001, Section 14-108, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 50, O.S.L. 2003 (70 O.S. Supp. 2006, Section 14-108), which relates to technology center school districts; authorizing technology center school district boards of education to convey surplus property to technology center school districts; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

1 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2001, Section 14-108, as last amended by
2 Section 1, Chapter 50, O.S.L. 2003 (70 O.S. Supp. 2006, Section 14-108), is amended to
3 read as follows:

4 Section 14-108. A. The State Board of Career and Technology Education shall
5 prescribe criteria and procedures for the establishment and governance of technology
6 center school districts, as provided by Section 9B, Article X, Oklahoma Constitution, and
7 such districts so established shall be operated in accordance with rules of the State Board
8 of Career and Technology Education, except as otherwise provided in this title.

9 B. A technology center school district shall be a body corporate and shall possess
10 the usual powers of a corporation for public purposes. Its official name shall be

1 designated by the State Board of Career and Technology Education, in which name it
2 may sue and be sued, and be capable of contracting and being contracted with, and
3 holding real and personal estate. Its governing board shall be a board of education
4 consisting of not less than five (5) nor more than seven (7) members elected in a manner
5 prescribed by the State Board of Career and Technology Education. Such board of
6 education shall have the same powers and duties that boards of education of independent
7 school districts have. It may require nonresident students to pay reasonable tuition fees,
8 which may be paid for a student by the independent or elementary school district in
9 which the student resides.

10 C. An election to vote on the question of making a levy of not to exceed five (5) mills
11 on the dollar valuation of the taxable property in a technology center school district
12 under the provisions of subsection A, Section 9B, Article X, Oklahoma Constitution, shall
13 be called by the board of education and conducted by the county election board of such
14 district in the same manner that elections for emergency levies in school districts under
15 the provisions of Section 9(d), Article X, Oklahoma Constitution, are called and
16 conducted. When such levy is approved by a majority of the electors of the technology
17 center school district voting on the question at such election, the levy shall be made each
18 fiscal year thereafter until repealed by a majority of the electors of the district voting on
19 the question at an election called for such purpose. An election to vote on the question of
20 making a local incentive levy of not to exceed five (5) mills on the dollar valuation of the
21 taxable property in a technology center school district under the provisions of subsection
22 B of Section 9B of Article X of the Oklahoma Constitution, may be called by the board of

1 education; and elections on a levy for a building fund for an area school district under the
2 provisions of Section 10, Article X, Oklahoma Constitution, shall be called by the board of
3 education of such district and conducted by the county election board in the same
4 manner that elections for similar levies are called and conducted in independent school
5 districts.

6 D. Annual estimates of needs of technology center school districts shall be made
7 and approved in the same manner that those of independent school districts are made
8 and approved. Provided, that the State Board of Career and Technology Education shall
9 prescribe a list of appropriation accounts by which the funds of technology center school
10 districts shall be budgeted, accounted for and expended. Any such estimate of needs may
11 include an estimate of federal funds as probable income from sources other than ad
12 valorem tax of the district and other than any excise or other tax assessed by legislative
13 enactment and distributed in lieu of ad valorem taxes. If a technology center school
14 district lies in more than one county, the district's estimate of needs shall be filed with
15 and approved by the county excise board of the county designated by the school district
16 board of education.

17 E. Territory may be annexed to or detached from a technology center school
18 district, in accordance with rules prescribed by the State Board of Career and Technology
19 Education. If the State Board of Career and Technology Education requires the
20 submission of a petition in order for an election to be called for the purpose of annexation
21 or deannexation of territory to a technology center school district, such petition shall not
22 be required to bear a number of technology center school district electors' signatures

1 which exceed fifty percent (50%) of the number of technology center school district
2 electors who voted in the last school board election in the territory proposed to be
3 annexed or deannexed. Provided, the period of time from which the petition is initiated
4 to its time of filing with the State Board shall not exceed ninety (90) days.

5 F. Schools of technology center school districts shall be subject to classification,
6 inspection and accreditation by the State Board of Education.

7 G. The technology center school board of education may designate a county
8 treasurer to serve as treasurer of the school district or may appoint an independent
9 treasurer.

10 H. Within four (4) years after the creation of a technology center school district,
11 such school district may, at its discretion, permit a teacher to transfer any or all accrued
12 benefits upon employment including credit for years of service in the previous school
13 district by the technology center school district, if the teacher at the time of hiring is
14 employed as a teacher by an independent or elementary school district which is all or
15 partly within the boundaries of the technology center school district or is employed as a
16 teacher in a skills center within the boundaries of the school district.

17 I. The board of education of a technology center school district may convey surplus
18 personal property without consideration to a:

19 1. A school district that is within the boundary of the technology center school
20 district ~~or a~~;

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1 2. A public school offering secondary level education which was created and is
2 operated by the State of Oklahoma and that is within the boundary of the technology
3 center school district; or

4 3. A technology center school district.

5 J. The board of education of a technology center school district may, without prior
6 approval of the State Board of Career and Technology Education, approve all plans and
7 specifications for technology center school buildings, additions, and major modifications
8 to school buildings that are designed to provide for the offering of vocational-technical
9 education programs and services when the cost of the building project is to be paid with
10 local levies or state bond monies or both local levies and state bond monies.

11 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2007.

12 SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public
13 peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof
14 this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
