SENATE BILL NO. 1759 - By: ADELSON of the Senate and COX of the House.

[state government - contracting for professional services - effective date]

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2001, Section 85.42, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 115, O.S.L. 2007 (74 O.S. Supp. 2007, Section 85.42), is amended to read as follows:

Section 85.42 A. Except as otherwise provided for in this section, any agency, whether or not such agency is subject to the Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act, is prohibited from entering into a sole source contract or a contract for professional services with or for the services of any person, who has terminated employment with or who has been terminated by that agency for one (1) year after the termination date of the employee from the agency. The provisions of this subsection shall not prohibit an agency from hiring or rehiring such person as a state employee.

B. Each contract entered into by any person or firm with the State of Oklahoma shall include an affidavit certifying that no person who has been involved in any manner in the development of

1 that contract while employed by the State of Oklahoma shall be
2 employed to fulfill any of the services provided for under said
3 contract. This subsection shall not preclude faculty and staff of
4 the institutions within The State System of Higher Education from
5 negotiating and participating in research grants and educational
6 contracts. Nor shall this subsection apply to personnel of the
7 Capital Resources Division of the Oklahoma Department of Commerce
8 who contract to provide services to the Oklahoma Capital Investment
9 Board.

10 C. As used in this section, person is defined as any state
11 official or employee of a department, board, bureau, commission,
12 agency, trusteeship, authority, council, committee, trust, school
13 district, fair board, court, executive office, advisory group, task
14 force, study group, supported in whole or in part by public funds or
15 entrusted with the expenditure of public funds or administering or
16 operating public property, and all committees, or subcommittees
17 thereof, judges, justices, and state legislators.

18 D. An agency may enter into a sole source contract or a
19 contract for professional services at any time with a person who is
20 a qualified interpreter for the deaf.

21 E. The Department of Transportation, Oklahoma Water Resources
22 Board, Department of Environmental Quality, Oklahoma Tourism and
23 Recreation Department, the Oklahoma Transportation Authority and the

1 Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry may enter
2 into a contract for professional services at any time with a person
3 who has retired from state service, provided the provisions
4 specified in subsection B of this section are satisfied.

5 F. The Department of Human Services may enter into a contract
6 for professional services related to computer application
7 development support and network engineering at any time with a
8 person who has separated from state service, provided the provisions
9 specified in subsection B of this section are satisfied.

10 G. To maintain public health infrastructure and preparedness,
11 the State Department of Health and city-county health departments
12 may enter into a contract for professional services at any time with
13 a physicians assistant, registered nurse, advanced practice nurse,
14 nurse midwife, registered dietitian, occupational therapist,
15 physical therapist, or speech-language pathologist who has retired
16 from state service; provided, the provisions specified in subsection
17 B of this section are also satisfied.

18 H. The Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services
19 may enter into a contract for professional services at any time with
20 a physician who has separated and/or retired from state service;
21 provided that the provisions specified in subsection B of this
22 section are satisfied.

23 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2008.
