6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to state government; requiring state  
8 agencies to develop an energy efficiency and  
9 conservation plan; requiring state agencies to  
10 consume a certain amount of renewable energy by a  
11 certain date; requiring the Department of Central  
12 Services to issue a report; providing definitions;  
13 providing for codification; and providing an  
14 effective date.

15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

16 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
17 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 130.30 of Title 74, unless there  
18 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

19 A. State agencies shall develop an energy efficiency and  
20 conservation plan. State agencies shall designate a person to  
21 develop and implement this energy efficiency and conservation plan.

22 B. By January 1, 2020, all state agencies shall ensure, to the  
23 extent economically feasible and technically practicable, that of  
24 the total amount of electric energy the state agency consumes during

1 a fiscal year, not less than twenty percent (20%) shall be renewable  
2 energy.

3 C. Not later than July 1, 2009, and every two (2) years  
4 thereafter, the Department of Central Services shall provide a  
5 report to Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and  
6 the President Pro Tempore of the Senate on the progress of state  
7 agencies in meeting the goal established in this section.

8 D. As used in this section:

9 1. "Biomass" means any lignin waste material that is segregated  
10 from other waste materials and is determined to be nonhazardous by  
11 the Department of Environment Quality and any solid, nonhazardous,  
12 cellulosic material that is derived from:

13 a. any of the following forest-related resources: mill  
14 residues, precommercial thinnings, slash, and brush,  
15 or nonmerchantable material,

16 b. solid wood waste materials, including waste pallets,  
17 crates, dunnage, manufacturing and construction wood  
18 wastes, other than pressure-treated, chemically-  
19 treated, or painted wood wastes, and landscape or  
20 right-of-way tree trimmings. Solid wood waste shall  
21 not include municipal solid waste, gas derived from  
22 the bio-degradation of solid waste, or paper that is  
23 commonly recycled,

- 1           c.    agricultural wastes, including orchard tree crops,  
2                    vineyard, grain, legumes, sugar, and other crop by-  
3                    products or residues, and livestock waste nutrients,  
4                    or  
5            d.    a plant that is grown exclusively as a fuel for the  
6                    production of electricity;

7           2.    "Renewable energy" means electric energy generated from  
8 solar, wind, biomass, landfill gas, ocean tidal currents, ocean wave  
9 currents, thermal, geothermal, municipal solid waste, or new  
10 hydroelectric generation capacity achieved from increased efficiency  
11 or additions of new capacity at an existing hydroelectric project;  
12 and

13           3.    "State agency" means any agency, department, board, or  
14 commission of the state.

15           SECTION 2.   This act shall become effective November 1, 2008.

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
