6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to soldiers and sailors; amending 72
8 O.S. 2001, Section 1, which relates to certain
9 affidavits regarding record and financial need of
disabled ex-service persons; clarifying language; and
providing an effective date.

12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

13 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 72 O.S. 2001, Section 1, is
14 amended to read as follows:

15 Section 1. It shall be lawful for any needy disabled ex-service
16 person, who has been a citizen and resident of this state for one
17 (1) year, to engage in what is commonly known as hawking and
18 peddling, to give illustrated lectures, magic lantern exhibitions
19 and such other like entertainments without either state, county,
20 city or town license or tax for the privilege of so doing. Before
21 any ex-service person shall be entitled to any of the privileges set
22 out in this act, ~~he shall make~~ an affidavit shall be made in writing
23 by the ex-service person before some officer authorized by law to
24 administer oaths, that ~~he~~ the ex-service person is a citizen and

1 resident of this state, and has been for one (1) year previous and
2 that ~~he~~ the ex-service person served in the military or naval forces
3 of the United States or of the Confederate States of America, and
4 was honorably discharged therefrom, and ~~that he~~ is in genuine
5 financial need of the privileges conferred by this act. A
6 certificate of the judge of the district court in which any
7 ex-service person has complied with the provisions of this act, and
8 ~~that he~~ is entitled to the benefits and privileges set out above,
9 shall be sufficient proof of the need or disability of said
10 ex-service person, and of said ex-service person's service in the
11 military or naval forces of the United States or of the Confederate
12 States of America. Such certificate shall be of public record in
13 the office of the county clerk in the county courthouse of the
14 county where it is issued, or shall be of record in the office of
15 the city clerk in the city where the privilege conferred herein is
16 to be exercised, and shall also be of record in the police station
17 of any such city. No single certificate shall be effective for a
18 period in excess of sixty (60) days, and all such certificates
19 heretofore issued shall become null and void sixty (60) days after
20 the effective date of this act.

21 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2008.
