6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to state government; requiring
8 contracts which expend state funds over a certain
9 amount to include certain health benefits; requiring
10 health benefits to be submitted with bid; requiring
11 certain benefits to be included in health plan;
12 providing for disqualification of certain persons;
13 providing for codification; and providing an
14 effective date.

15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

16 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
17 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 193.1 of Title 40, unless there
18 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

19 A. Any contract involving an obligation or expenditure of state
20 funds, either wholly or in part shall require the contractor of such
21 contract to offer health benefits to its employees. The contractor
22 shall offer health benefits to those employees assigned to perform
23 the duties pursuant to the terms of the contract and shall be
24 offered to the employees for the duration of the contract. The
health benefits specified pursuant to this section shall only be
offered on contracts that have a total cost of more than One Hundred

1 Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00). The health benefits plan to be
2 offered pursuant to this section shall be submitted in conjunction
3 with the bid of the contractor to the entity soliciting health. A
4 basic health benefits plan offered to the employees of the
5 contractor shall consist of the following elements:

6 1. Not more than fifty percent (50%) shall be paid by the
7 employee;

8 2. Coverage for basic hospital care;

9 3. Coverage for physician care; and

10 4. Coverage for prescription drugs.

11 B. Any contractor who does not comply with subsection A of this
12 section shall thereafter be disqualified to submit any bid or accept
13 or enter into or be awarded any contract involving an obligation or
14 expenditure of state funds for a period of one (1) year.

15 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2008.
