6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to tourism; amending Sections 40 and
8 53, Chapter 363, O.S.L. 2005 (74 O.S. Supp. 2007,
9 Sections 2239 and 2252), which relate to the Oklahoma
10 Today Magazine and the Oklahoma Today Magazine
11 Revolving Fund; modifying exemptions from the
12 Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act; authorizing revenues
13 generated by the Oklahoma Today Magazine to be
14 deposited in the Oklahoma Today Magazine Revolving
15 Fund; and providing an effective date.

16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

17 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 40, Chapter 363, O.S.L.
18 2005 (74 O.S. Supp. 2007, Section 2239), is amended to read as
19 follows:

20 Section 2239. Merchandise for resale purchased for and sold
21 through "Oklahoma Today Magazine" or in Department retail outlets,
22 such as golf course pro shops, marinas, restaurants, and other
23 support facilities which are necessary for the efficient and
24 economical operation of Department-operated facilities and programs
and production of merchandise for resale, are exempt from the
Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act. Payment for services of writers,

1 artists, photographers or others ~~involved in the artistic production~~
2 of "Oklahoma Today Magazine" and other products produced by the
3 ~~magazine such as separators, prepress houses, film houses and such~~
4 as designers, prepress houses, and shippers of artistic and resale
5 merchandise involved in the artistic production of "Oklahoma Today
6 Magazine" and other products produced by the magazine shall also be
7 exempt from the Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act. Production and
8 mailing of revenue-generating materials such as monthly renewals and
9 direct mail efforts which are necessary to the ongoing operation of
10 "Oklahoma Today Magazine" shall also be exempt from the Oklahoma
11 Central Purchasing Act.

12 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY Section 53, Chapter 363, O.S.L.
13 2005 (74 O.S. Supp. 2007, Section 2252), is amended to read as
14 follows:

15 Section 2252. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a
16 revolving fund for the Department to be designated the "Oklahoma
17 Today Magazine Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a continuing
18 fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of
19 all revenues generated by "Oklahoma Today Magazine" and all monies
20 received by the Department from donations, gifts and bequests by
21 individuals, corporations, organizations, associations and
22 foundations specifying that such monies be expended on "Oklahoma
23 Today Magazine" and its ancillary products and activities. No state
24 monies shall be deposited in this fund. From monies deposited in

1 this fund, the Executive Director may reimburse the publisher of
2 "Oklahoma Today Magazine" and its staff for all actual and necessary
3 expenses for travel, subsistence and entertainment in order to gain
4 advertising and promotion for "Oklahoma Today Magazine", pursuant to
5 Section 500.18 of ~~Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes~~ this title. All
6 monies accruing to the credit of said fund are hereby appropriated
7 and may be budgeted and expended by the Department for the purpose
8 of supporting and promoting "Oklahoma Today Magazine" and its
9 ancillary products and activities, and for soliciting contributions
10 for other expenses for "Oklahoma Today Magazine", so that the
11 magazine can become self-supporting and not dependent on state-
12 appropriated funds in the future. Expenditures from the fund shall
13 be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims
14 filed as prescribed by law with the Director of State Finance for
15 approval and payment.

16 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2008.
