6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to professions and occupations;
8 amending 59 O.S. 2001, Section 1850.7, which relates
9 to the Mechanical Licensing Act; providing exception
10 to certain license required; requiring the
11 Construction Industries Board to establish a process
12 for a mechanical apprentice to work as a mechanical
13 journeyman under certain circumstances; providing for
14 codification; and providing an effective date.

15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

16 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2001, Section 1850.7, is
17 amended to read as follows:

18 Section 1850.7 No person shall engage or offer to engage in, by
19 advertisement or otherwise, any mechanical work as a journeyman or
20 contractor who does not possess a valid and appropriate license from
21 the Construction Industries Board, provided that a mechanical
22 apprentice may act as a mechanical journeyman as provided for in
23 Section 2 of this act. No business entity shall act as a mechanical
24 firm unless a contractor is associated with and responsible for all
mechanical work of such entity.

1 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
2 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1850.9A of Title 59, unless
3 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

4 The Construction Industries Board shall establish by rule a
5 process for a mechanical apprentice to work as a mechanical
6 journeyman in any county with a population of sixty thousand
7 (60,000) people or less, provided that the apprentice is able to be
8 in direct contact with a mechanical contractor by phone or cell
9 phone at all times when the apprentice is working as a journeyman.

10 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2008.

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
