6 AS INTRODUCED

7 A Joint Resolution recognizing the contribution of  
8 Max R. Newberry to the Department of Corrections; and  
9 renaming the building known as the Oklahoma  
10 Correctional Industries Building to the Max Newberry  
11 Correctional Industrial Administration Building; and  
12 directing distribution.

13 WHEREAS, the Oklahoma Correctional Industries Building located  
14 in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, is currently the administration facility  
15 for the correctional industries operation within the Department of  
16 Corrections; and

17 WHEREAS, Max R. Newberry was designated the Director of  
18 Industrial Production on January 1, 1976, to manage the correctional  
19 industries operation within the Department of Corrections, and he  
20 remained the administrator of the correctional industries operation  
21 until his retirement on February 1, 2000, with the official  
22 designation of Administrator of Industrial Production of the  
23 Department of Corrections; and

24 WHEREAS, Max R. Newberry dedicated his entire correctional  
career to the growth and development of the production of industrial

1 goods, furniture and other useful items made by inmates in the  
2 custody of the Department of Corrections, and he contributed his  
3 knowledge, skill and expertise to making the correctional industries  
4 operation within the Department of Corrections a successful  
5 endeavor; and

6 WHEREAS, since Max R. Newberry's retirement as the Administrator  
7 of Industrial Production in February, 2000, the Department of  
8 Corrections has realized the extent and value of his long-term  
9 service to the correctional industries operation within the  
10 Department.

11 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF  
12 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 51ST OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:

13 SECTION 1. The building located at 3402 Martin Luther King  
14 Avenue in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, previously known as the Oklahoma  
15 Correctional Industries Building, shall be renamed the Max Newberry  
16 Correctional Industrial Administration Building in honor of Max R.  
17 Newberry's dedication and contribution to the development of the  
18 correctional industries operation in Oklahoma; and

19 SECTION 2. The Secretary of State shall distribute copies of  
20 this joint resolution to Max R. Newberry and the Director of the  
21 Department of Corrections.
