6 AS INTRODUCED

7 A Resolution praising the life of Edward C. Joullian
8 III; mourning his loss; and directing distribution.

10 WHEREAS, Edward C. Joullian III was born August 12, 1929, in
11 Blackwell, Oklahoma, and attended Edgemere Elementary School and
12 Wilson School in Oklahoma City. He attended New Mexico Military
13 Institute in Roswell, New Mexico, and received a degree in
14 mechanical engineering from Oklahoma State University; and

15 WHEREAS, Edward Joullian III served as a First Lieutenant in the
16 United States Army during the Korean Conflict as Commanding Officer
17 of a petroleum products laboratory; and

18 WHEREAS, since 1964 Edward Joullian III had served as President
19 and chaired the Board of Directors of Mustang Fuel Corporation and
20 its subsidiaries. He served as President and Director of American
21 Fidelity Companies and as Chair of the Board and Chief Executive
22 Officer of First Oklahoma Bancorporation. He also served as Chair
23 of the Board of the LTV Corporation, the First National Bank and
24 Trust Company of Oklahoma City, Fleming Companies, and Joullian

1 Vineyards. He also served as President of the Gas Processors
2 Association; and

3 WHEREAS, Edward Joullian III was an outstanding civic leader,
4 serving as the Chair of the Board of the Oklahoma State Fair for ten
5 years; Chair of the Board of Governors for Oklahoma Christian
6 University; President of the Board of Directors of the National
7 Cowboy and Western Heritage Museum; and Trustee for the Oklahoma
8 Industries Authority, as well as Executive Committee member and
9 Director of the Oklahoma City Chamber of Commerce; Director of the
10 Oklahoma City Chapter of the National Conference of Christians and
11 Jews; President of Trustees and Trustee of Casady School; President
12 of the Oklahoma City Community Foundation; President of Junior
13 Achievement of Greater Oklahoma City; and Chair of the Oklahoma
14 Chapter of the Young Presidents' Organization; and

15 WHEREAS, Edward Joullian III was inducted into the New Mexico
16 Military Institute Alumni Hall of Fame, the Oklahoma State
17 University College of Engineering, Architecture and Technology Hall
18 of Fame, the Oklahoma State University Hall of Fame, and Oklahoma
19 Hall of Fame. He was King of the Beaux Arts Ball in 1986 and
20 received an honorary doctorate of law from Oklahoma Christian
21 University. He also received the God and Service Award from the
22 United Methodist Church, the Distinguished Alumnus Award from
23 Oklahoma State University, the Annual Brotherhood Award presented by
24 the National Conference of Christians and Jews, the George E. Ward

1 Memorial Award, the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine
2 Dean's Award for Distinguished Community Service, and the Henry G.
3 Bennett Distinguished Service Award; and

4 WHEREAS, Edward Joullian III was a founding trustee of the
5 Oklahoma Foundation for Excellence, serving from 1986 until his
6 death. Since 1983 more than five hundred Oklahoma teachers have
7 participated in the Colonial Williamsburg Teacher Institute, and
8 thousands of students have received electronic tours of Colonial
9 Williamsburg, thanks to his leadership. He was a Trustee of the
10 Colonial Williamsburg Foundation; and

11 WHEREAS, Edward Joullian III joined the Cub Scout Pack at
12 Edgemere Elementary School in 1938, became a Boy Scout in Troop 31
13 at Wilson School, and an Eagle Scout in Troop 15 at First
14 Presbyterian Church. He continued his service to the scouts as an
15 adult, being selected to serve as President and Executive Board
16 Member of the Last Frontier Council of the Boy Scouts of America,
17 President of the Boy Scouts of America in 1982, and Chair of the
18 World Scout Foundation in 1990. He earned scouting's Silver Beaver,
19 Silver Antelope, Silver Buffalo, Silver Fox, and Bronze Wolf awards.
20 He was also awarded the Distinguished Eagle Scout Award; and

21 WHEREAS, Edward C. Joullian III died September 25, 2006, at the
22 age of 77 years.

23 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 1ST SESSION
24 OF THE 51ST OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:

1 THAT the Oklahoma State Senate praises the many accomplishments
2 of Edward C. Joullian III and his life of selfless service to
3 others.

4 THAT the Oklahoma State Senate joins with family, friends, and
5 associates of the late Edward C. Joullian III in mourning the loss
6 of this outstanding Oklahoma businessman and civic leader.

7 THAT a copy of this resolution be distributed to Edward
8 Joullian's wife, Letitia; son, E. Carey Joullian IV; daughter,
9 Marion Joullian Story; and sister, Jeannette Joullian Sias.
