Summary

ESB 2028 makes it a felony to forcibly or fraudulently take or entice an incapacitated person with intent to detain and conceal such person from his or her guardian.

Analysis

Persons convicted of forcibly detaining and concealing an incapacitated person from their guardian or transporting such person without consent of the guardian may receive up to ten years imprisonment. Each person convicted and sentenced to a prison term will cost the state approximately \$52 per day for each day of incarceration. The fiscal impact of ESB 2028 would be dependent upon the number of adjudicated cases and the prison term imposed.
