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22 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:  
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1 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2001, Section 6-106, as  
2 last amended by Section 6, Chapter 326, O.S.L. 2007 (47 O.S. Supp.  
3 2009, Section 6-106), is amended to read as follows:

4 Section 6-106. A. 1. Every application for a driver license  
5 or identification card shall be made by the applicant upon a form  
6 furnished by the Department of Public Safety.

7 2. Every original, renewal, or replacement application for a  
8 driver license or identification card made by a male applicant who  
9 is at least sixteen (16) but less than twenty-six (26) years of age  
10 shall include a statement that by submitting the application, the  
11 applicant is consenting to registration with the Selective Service  
12 System. The pertinent information from the application shall be  
13 forwarded by the Department to the Data Management Center of the  
14 Selective Service System in order to register the applicant as  
15 required by law with the Selective Service System. Any applicant  
16 refusing to sign the consent statement shall be denied a driver  
17 license or identification card.

18 3. Every applicant for a driver license or identification card  
19 shall provide to the Department at the time of application both  
20 primary and secondary proofs of identity. The Department shall  
21 promulgate rules prescribing forms of primary and secondary  
22 identification acceptable for an original Oklahoma driver license.

23 B. Every applicant for a driver license shall state upon the  
24 application the following information:

- 1 1. Full name;
- 2 2. Date of birth;
- 3 3. Sex;
- 4 4. Residence address and county of residence to be displayed on  
5 the license;
- 6 5. Mailing address to be maintained by the Department for the  
7 purpose of giving notice, if necessary, as required by Section 2-116  
8 of this title;
- 9 6. Medical information, as determined by the Department, which  
10 shall assure the Department that the person is not prohibited from  
11 being licensed as provided by paragraph 7 of subsection A of Section  
12 6-103 of this title;
- 13 7. Whether the applicant is deaf or hard-of-hearing;
- 14 8. A brief description of the applicant, as determined by the  
15 Department;
- 16 9. Whether the applicant has previously been licensed, and, if  
17 so, when and by what state or country, and whether any license has  
18 ever been suspended or revoked, or whether an application has ever  
19 been refused, and, if so, the date of and reason for the suspension,  
20 revocation or refusal;
- 21 10. Whether the applicant is an alien eligible to be considered  
22 for licensure and is not prohibited from licensure pursuant to  
23 paragraph 9 of subsection A of Section 6-103 of this title;
- 24 11. Whether the applicant has:

- 1 a. previously been licensed and, if so, when and by what  
2 state or country, and  
3 b. held more than one license at the same time during the  
4 immediately preceding ten (10) years; and

5 12. Social security number.

6 No person shall request the Department to use the social security  
7 number of that person as the driver license number. Upon renewal or  
8 replacement of any driver license issued after the effective date of  
9 this act, the licensee shall advise the Department or the motor  
10 license agent if the present driver license number of the licensee  
11 is the social security number of the licensee. If the driver  
12 license number is the social security number, the Department or the  
13 motor license agent shall change the driver license number to a  
14 computer-generated alphanumeric identification.

15 C. In addition to the requirements of subsections A and B of  
16 this section, every applicant for a commercial driver license with a  
17 hazardous material endorsement shall submit to a security threat  
18 assessment performed by the Transportation Security Administration  
19 of the Department of Homeland Security as required by and pursuant  
20 to 49 C.F.R., Part 1572, which shall be used to determine whether  
21 the applicant is eligible for the endorsement pursuant to federal  
22 law and regulation.

23 The Department of Public Safety shall notify each commercial  
24 driving school of the passage of this section, and each commercial

1 driving school shall notify prospective students of its school of  
2 the hazardous material endorsement requirement.

3 D. Upon the effective date of this act and in addition to the  
4 requirements of subsections A and B of this section, every applicant  
5 shall be given an option on the application for issuance of a driver  
6 license or identification card or renewal pursuant to Section 6-115  
7 of this title to provide an emergency contact person. The emergency  
8 contact information requested may include full name, address, and  
9 phone number. The emergency contact information shall be maintained  
10 by the Department and shall be used by the Department and law  
11 enforcement for emergency purposes only. A person listed as an  
12 emergency contact may request to be removed at any time. Any update  
13 to a change of name, address, or phone number may be made by the  
14 applicant listing the emergency contact person or by the person  
15 listed as the emergency contact.

16 E. Whenever application is received from a person previously  
17 licensed in another jurisdiction, the Department shall request a  
18 copy of the driving record from the other jurisdiction and,  
19 effective September 1, 2005, from all other jurisdictions in which  
20 the person was licensed within the immediately previous ten (10)  
21 years. When received, the driving record shall become a part of the  
22 driving record of the person in this state with the same force and  
23 effect as though entered on the driver's record in this state in the  
24 original instance.
