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12 AMENDMENT NO. 1. Strike the stricken title, enacting clause and
13 entire bill and insert

14 "An Act relating to public finance; amending Section
15 1, Chapter 340, O.S.L. 2008, as amended by Section
16 6, Chapter 451, O.S.L. 2009 (62 O.S. Supp. 2009,
17 Section 41.5a-4), which relates to the Information
18 Services Division of the Office of State Finance;
19 clarifying type of electronic storage for removal;
20 specifying type of electronic storage media eligible
21 for certain funds; and declaring an emergency.

22 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

23 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 1, Chapter 340, O.S.L.
24 2008, as amended by Section 6, Chapter 451, O.S.L. 2009 (62 O.S.
Supp. 2009, Section 41.5a-4), is amended to read as follows:

1 Section 41.5a-4 A. The Information Services Division of the
2 Office of State Finance is authorized to:

3 1. Develop and publish a state policy and procedures for the
4 destruction or disposal of all electronic storage media to ensure
5 that all confidential information stored on such electronic media
6 devices is destroyed or disposed of in a secure and safe manner;

7 2. Define the requirements for the secure destruction or
8 disposal of electronic storage media; and

9 3. Assist the Department of Central Services in implementing
10 the policy and procedures for the destruction or disposal of state
11 electronic storage media.

12 B. The Information Services Division of the Office of State
13 Finance shall notify all agencies, boards, commissions and
14 authorities of the policy and procedures for the secure and safe
15 destruction or disposal of electronic storage media.

16 C. The Department of Central Services shall remove all data
17 from electronic storage media from all surplus information
18 technology and telecommunication equipment before it is sold,
19 donated, stored or destroyed. A state agency may remove electronic
20 storage media from their surplus information technology and
21 telecommunication equipment prior to sending the surplus to the
22 Department of Central Services, so long as the agency has the
23 technical expertise for removal and that the electronic storage
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1 media is sent for destruction or disposal pursuant to this
2 subsection.

3 D. The Department of Central Services shall use existing and
4 future funds from the sale of state surplus equipment and
5 appropriations, as necessary, to pay for the destruction of
6 electronic storage media of equipment processed through the
7 Department of Central Services.

8 SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
9 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
10 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
11 be in full force from and after its passage and approval."
