14 AMENDMENT NO. 1. Strike the title, enacting clause and entire bill
and insert

15 "An Act relating to schools; amending 70 O.S. 2001,
16 Section 1210.507, as last amended by Section 3,
17 Chapter 289, O.S.L. 2006 (70 O.S. Supp. 2009,
18 Section 1210.507), which relates to the Oklahoma
19 School Testing Program Act; providing for testing of
20 students enrolled in certain online courses or
21 programs at certain alternative testing locations;
22 specifying certain alternative testing location
23 sites; making alternative testing locations subject
24 to certain rules; making certain school districts or
charter school responsible for certain costs;
requiring alternative testing locations to be at
geographically dispersed sites; allowing additional
alternative testing locations; and providing an
effective date.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

2 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2001, Section 1210.507, as
3 last amended by Section 3, Chapter 289, O.S.L. 2006 (70 O.S. Supp.
4 2009, Section 1210.507), is amended to read as follows:

5 Section 1210.507 A. The State Board of Education shall
6 promulgate rules necessary for the implementation and administration
7 of the provisions of the Oklahoma School Testing Program Act.

8 B. The State Board of Education shall require school district
9 boards of education to annually provide information to the
10 district's students, parents of students, and the public at large
11 about the proper meaning and use of tests administered pursuant to
12 the provisions of the Oklahoma School Testing Program Act. The
13 Department shall develop materials and make them available to school
14 districts regarding the Oklahoma School Testing Program.

15 C. Students enrolled in an online course or program that is
16 offered by a school district or charter school that is not the
17 district of residence or is not located in the district of residence
18 of the student shall be provided the opportunity to take any test
19 required pursuant to the Oklahoma School Testing Program Act or any
20 other test generally required of students by the school district in
21 which the student is enrolled at an alternative testing location
22 approved by the State Board of Education. The alternative testing
23 locations may be at sites that are not in the school district that
24 is offering the online course or program or the district of

1 residence. Alternative testing locations may include technology
2 center school sites or any other testing location selected by the
3 school district or charter school offering the online course or
4 program. All alternative testing locations shall be subject to
5 testing location rules promulgated by the State Board of Education.
6 The school district or charter school offering the online course or
7 program shall be responsible for any cost incurred in providing an
8 alternative testing location and any additional cost of
9 administering a test at an alternative testing location. In order
10 to provide alternative testing locations at geographically dispersed
11 sites, the school district or charter school offering the online
12 course or program shall, at a minimum, provide not less than six
13 alternative testing locations, with at least one location in each
14 quadrant of the state and in each of the two metropolitan areas in
15 the state. Additional alternative testing locations may be provided
16 by the school district or charter school offering the online course
17 or program.

18 D. The State Board of Education shall seek to establish and
19 post on the Internet a sample test item bank that will be made
20 available to teachers and will allow them to create and deliver
21 classroom assessments throughout the school year to check for
22 student mastery of key concepts assessed by the criterion-referenced
23 tests administered to students pursuant to the Oklahoma School
24 Testing Program Act. Subject to the availability of funds, the

1 Board shall annually release end-of-instruction test items and make
2 them available to the public.

3 ~~D.~~ E. The State Board of Education shall post on the Internet
4 criterion-referenced sample tests for each grade level and subject
5 matter test administered to students pursuant to the Oklahoma School
6 Testing Program Act for the purpose of communicating expectation
7 concerning test difficulty level and format to teacher, parents and
8 students. The Board shall maintain the sample tests on the Internet
9 throughout the year and, as changes are made in the state academic
10 content standards, known as the Priority Academic Student Skills
11 Curriculum, the Board shall update the sample tests. The Board
12 shall seek to expand the number of sample test items each year and
13 to revise test items as needed. The sample tests shall reflect the
14 actual test administered to students and may contain questions used
15 on actual tests given in previous years.

16 ~~E.~~ F. The State Board of Education shall seek to implement an
17 electronic delivery system for all tests administered pursuant to
18 the Oklahoma School Testing Program Act that will allow students to
19 participate in computer-based assessments in order to expedite the
20 delivery and use of the test results.

21 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2010."
