8	An Act relating to public health; creating the Oklahoma Sleep Diagnostic Testing Regulation Act;
9	providing short title; stating legislative findings; defining terms; requiring certain testing to be
10	ordered by a physician and conducted in certain facilities meeting certain standards; making certain
11	testing unlawful under certain circumstances; designating the State Department of Health the
12	official agency for the regulation of certain activities; authorizing the Department to promulgate
13	certain rules; providing for a certain board certified physician to be used by the Department for
14 15	certain purposes; providing for codification; and declaring an emergency.
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17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
18	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
19	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 7200.1 of Title 63, unless there
20	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
21	This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma Sleep
22	Diagnostic Testing Regulation Act".
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SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 7200.2 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. The legislature hereby finds that:

- 1. There is a growing need for sleep diagnostic testing in the diagnosis and treatment of sleep disorders;
 - 2. Sleep diagnostic testing is being performed in Oklahoma; and

Oklahoma law does not provide sufficient regulation of sleep

- diagnostic testing to assure the protection of the public.

 Therefore, there is a need to provide legislation to enable the appropriate entities to regulate persons performing sleep diagnostic
- SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 7200.3 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

As used in the Oklahoma Sleep Diagnostic Testing Regulation Act:

1. "Direct supervision" means the supervising physician is present in the sleep diagnostic testing facility and immediately available to furnish assistance and direction throughout the performance of the sleep diagnostic testing. It does not require that the supervising physician be present in the room when the sleep diagnostic testing is performed.

2. "Sleep diagnostic testing facility" means a building or place situated in a fixed location or a mobile facility that is used for sleep diagnostic tests, provided:

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- a. a sleep diagnostic testing facility shall not include a hospital-based facility that is used for sleep diagnostic tests. A facility is hospital-based if:
 - (1) the facility and hospital are subject to the bylaws and operating decisions of a common governing board. This governing board, which has final administrative responsibility, approves all personnel actions, appoints medical staff and carries out similar management functions,
 - (2) the facility director or administrator is under the supervision of the hospital's chief executive officer and reports through him or her to the governing board,
 - (3) the facility personnel policies and practices conform to those of the hospital,
 - (4) the administrative functions of the facility such as records, billing, laundry, housekeeping and purchasing are integrated with those of the hospital, and

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(5) the facility and hospital are financially integrated, as evidenced by the cost report,

which reflects allocation of overhead to the 1 2 facility through the required step-down methodology, and

- b. the following factors are not considered in the determination of whether a facility conducting sleep diagnostic tests is hospital-based:
 - an agreement between a facility and a hospital (1)concerning patient referral,
 - (2) a shared service arrangement between a facility and a hospital, or
 - the physical location of a facility on the (3) premises of a hospital.
- 3. "General supervision" means the sleep diagnostic testing is furnished under the supervising physician's overall direction and control, but the supervising physician is not necessarily required during the performance of the sleep diagnostic testing.
- "Interpreting physician" means a physician who determines the meaning of sleep diagnostic test results conducted at or under the control of the sleep diagnostic testing facility.
- "Personal supervision" means a supervising physician is 5. physically present in the sleep diagnostic testing room during the performance of the sleep diagnostic testing.
 - 6. "Physician" means a person licensed to practice:

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a. allopathic medicine and surgery by the Oklahoma State

Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision pursuant to
the Oklahoma Allopathic Medical and Surgical Licensure
and Supervision Act, or

- b. osteopathic medicine by the State Board of Osteopathic
 Examiners pursuant to the Oklahoma Osteopathic
 Medicine Act.
- 7. "Sleep diagnostic test" means any technological recording procedure used for the diagnosis of sleep related breathing disorders. Sleep diagnostic test shall also mean Multiple Sleep Latency Testing which measures physiologic sleepiness and Maintenance of Wakefulness Testing which measures manifest sleepiness. Sleep diagnostic tests are classified by level of intensity accordingly:
 - a. Level I or Type 1: Attended standard polysomnography(PSG) performed in a sleep diagnostic testing facility,
 - b. Level II or Type 2: Home sleep test (HST) with type II portable monitor, unattended; minimum of 7 channels:
 EEG, EOG, EMG, ECG/heart rate, airflow, respiratory
 effort and oxygen saturation,
 - c. Level III or Type 3: Home sleep test (HST) with type III portable monitor, unattended; minimum of 4

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channels: 2 respiratory movement/airflow, 1 ECG/heart
rate and loxygen saturation, and

- d. Level IV or Type 4: Home sleep test (HST) with type IV portable monitor, unattended; minimum of 3 channels.
- 8. "Supervising physician" means a physician responsible for the personal, direct or general supervision of the sleep diagnostic testing performed, including but not limited to, the quality of the testing performed, the proper operation and calibration of the equipment used to perform sleep diagnostic tests and the actions of non-physician personnel engaged in the performance of the sleep diagnostic testing.
- SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 7200.4 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Sleep diagnostic tests whether conducted in a sleep diagnostic testing facility or home-based shall be ordered by a physician and conducted in or under the direction of personnel of a sleep diagnostic testing facility that meets the following standards:

- Sleep diagnostic testing facilities conducting sleep diagnostic tests shall be under the direction of a supervising physician;
- 2. A supervising physician of a sleep diagnostic testing facility shall be board certified in Sleep Medicine by the American

1 Board of Sleep Medicine (ABSM) or the American Board of Medical 2 Specialties;

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- 3. Results of sleep diagnostic tests conducted by a sleep diagnostic testing facility shall be interpreted by an interpreting physician;
- 4. An interpreting physician shall be board certified in Sleep Medicine by the American Board of Sleep Medicine (ABSM) or the American Board of Medical Specialties; and
- 5. Sleep technicians conducting sleep diagnostic tests must practice under the general, direct or personal supervision of the supervising physician and must be Registered Polysomnographic Technicians (RPSGT) or Registered Respiratory Therapists (RRT) who have taken and successfully passed the separate sleep credentialing examination administered by the National Board of Respiratory Therapy or the Associated Professional Sleep Societies.
- SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 7200.5 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. It shall be unlawful for any facility or person to perform sleep diagnostic tests unless the facility has first obtained a license to perform sleep diagnostic tests in compliance with this act or as may otherwise be allowed by applicable law.
- B. The State Department of Health is hereby designated as the official agency of this state for all regulatory activities

pertaining to health and safety in performing sleep diagnostic tests and may promulgate rules to implement the provisions of the Oklahoma Sleep Diagnostic Testing Regulation Act, including, but not limited to, application and licensure requirements, procedures for inspection, monitoring and investigation of complaints, standards for suspension and revocation of license and imposition of fees.

C. A physician board certified in sleep medicine by the American Board of Sleep Medicine or the American Board of Medical Specialties, who is not in competition with a facility, shall be used by the State Department of Health to assure compliance with this act including, but not limited to, conducting surveys of facilities and inspecting, monitoring and investigating complaints.

SECTION 6. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
