11 CONFERENCE COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

12 An Act relating to the Corporation Commission;  
13 requiring budgeting in certain categories and  
14 amounts; providing for duties and compensation of  
15 employees; providing budgetary limitations; allowing  
16 certain transfer; providing lapse dates; requiring  
17 certain budgeting practices; prohibiting certain  
18 budgeting practices; providing an effective date;  
19 and declaring an emergency.

20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

21 SECTION 1. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010, the  
22 Corporation Commission shall budget all funds in the following  
23 categories and amounts:

11 SECTION 2. The duties and compensation of employees, not  
12 otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed  
13 upon the Corporation Commission by law shall be set by the  
14 Corporation Commission. The Corporation Commission shall be subject  
15 to the following budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent  
16 employees and expenditures excluding direct expenditures for well  
17 plugging as authorized in Section 310 of Title 52 of the Oklahoma  
18 Statutes, pit closure as authorized in Section 140 of Title 52 of  
19 the Oklahoma Statutes, and remediation of sites as authorized in  
20 Section 353 of Title 17 of the Oklahoma Statutes, and as may be  
21 authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of  
22 the Oklahoma Statutes:

2 SECTION 3. TRANSFER The Corporation Commission is  
3 authorized to transfer Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars  
4 (\$250,000.00) from the Petroleum Storage Tank Indemnity Fund to the  
5 "202 Fund" of the Corporation Commission for the purposes of  
6 performing the duties placed upon the Corporation Commission by the  
7 Oklahoma Legislature.

8 SECTION 4. Appropriations made by Section 89 of Enrolled Senate  
9 Bill No. 216 of the 1st Session of the 52nd Oklahoma Legislature,  
10 not including appropriations made for capital outlay purposes, may  
11 be budgeted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010 (hereafter FY-  
12 10) or may be budgeted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011  
13 (hereafter FY-11). Funds budgeted for FY-10 may be encumbered only  
14 through June 30, 2010, and must be expended by November 15, 2010.  
15 Any funds remaining after November 15, 2010, and not budgeted for  
16 FY-11, shall lapse to the credit of the proper fund for the then  
17 current fiscal year. Funds budgeted for FY-11 may be encumbered  
18 only through June 30, 2011. Any funds remaining after November 15,  
19 2011, shall lapse to the credit of the proper fund for the then  
20 current fiscal year. These appropriations may not be budgeted in  
21 both fiscal years simultaneously. Funds budgeted in FY-10, and not  
22 required to pay obligations for that fiscal year, may be budgeted  
23 for FY-11, after the agency to which the funds have been  
24 appropriated has prepared and submitted a budget work program

1 revision removing these funds from the FY-10 budget work program and  
2 after such revision has been approved by the Office of State  
3 Finance.

4 SECTION 5. This act shall become effective July 1, 2009.

5 SECTION 6. It being immediately necessary for the preservation  
6 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby  
7 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and  
8 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
