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10 CONFERENCE COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

11 An Act relating to the Oklahoma Commission for
12 Teacher Preparation; providing for budgeting of funds
13 in certain categories and amounts; requiring
14 performance measures for budget categories; providing
15 for duties and compensation of employees; limiting
16 the maximum salary of the Executive Director;
17 providing budgetary limitations; requiring budgeting
18 of certain funds in certain years; requiring certain
19 budget procedures; prohibiting certain budget
20 procedures; providing lapse dates; providing an
21 effective date; and declaring an emergency.

22 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

23 SECTION 1. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010, the
24 Oklahoma Commission for Teacher Preparation shall budget all funds
in the following categories and amounts:

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1 Preparation and Professional
2 Development of Teachers and
3 Administrators \$1,915,783.00 \$12,873,290.00

4 The Commission shall develop outcome-based performance measures
5 for each budget category.

6 SECTION 2. The duties and compensation of employees, not
7 otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed
8 upon the Oklahoma Commission for Teacher Preparation by law shall be
9 set by the Executive Director of the Oklahoma Commission for Teacher
10 Preparation. The salary of the Executive Director shall not exceed
11 Seventy-two Thousand Five Hundred Fifteen Dollars (\$72,515.00) per
12 annum, payable monthly for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010.
13 The Oklahoma Commission for Teacher Preparation for the fiscal year
14 ending June 30, 2010, shall be subject to the following budgetary
15 limitations on full-time-equivalent employees except as may be
16 authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of
17 the Oklahoma Statutes:

18 <u>Budgetary Limitation</u>	<u>Amount</u>
19 Full-time-equivalent Employees	10.0

20 SECTION 3. Appropriations made by Section 14 of Enrolled Senate
21 Bill No. 216 of the 1st Session of the 52nd Oklahoma Legislature,
22 not including appropriations made for capital outlay purposes, may
23 be budgeted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010 (hereafter FY-
24 10) or may be budgeted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011

1 (hereafter FY-11). Funds budgeted for FY-10 may be encumbered only
2 through June 30, 2010, and must be expended by November 15, 2010.
3 Any funds remaining after November 15, 2010, and not budgeted for
4 FY-11, shall lapse to the credit of the proper fund for the then
5 current fiscal year. Funds budgeted for FY-11 may be encumbered
6 only through June 30, 2011. Any funds remaining after November 15,
7 2011, shall lapse to the credit of the proper fund for the then
8 current fiscal year. These appropriations may not be budgeted in
9 both fiscal years simultaneously. Funds budgeted in FY-10, and not
10 required to pay obligations for that fiscal year, may be budgeted
11 for FY-11, after the agency to which the funds have been
12 appropriated has prepared and submitted a budget work program
13 revision removing these funds from the FY-10 budget work program and
14 after such revision has been approved by the Office of State
15 Finance.

16 SECTION 4. This act shall become effective July 1, 2009.

17 SECTION 5. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
18 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
19 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
20 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
