9 2001, Section 150.23, as last amended by Section 3,
10 Chapter 169, O.S.L. 2005 (74 O.S. Supp. 2009, Section
11 150.23), which relates to authority of retired state
12 employees to retain possession certain sidearms and
13 badges; authorizing certain retired Department of
14 Human Services employees retain possession of
15 sidearms and badges; and providing an effective date.

16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

17 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2001, Section 150.23, as
18 last amended by Section 3, Chapter 169, O.S.L. 2005 (74 O.S. Supp.
19 2009, Section 150.23), is amended to read as follows:

20 Section 150.23 A. An officer, investigator, or agent of the
21 Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation, the Oklahoma State Bureau of
22 Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control, the Department of Wildlife
23 Conservation, the Law Enforcement Division of the Oklahoma Horse
24 Racing Commission, the State Fire Marshal's Office, the Oklahoma
Tourism and Recreation Department, or the office of a district

1 attorney shall be entitled to receive, upon retirement by reason of
2 length of service, the continued custody and possession of the
3 sidearm and badge carried by such officer, investigator, or agent
4 immediately prior to retirement. In addition, investigators or
5 agents of the Department of Human Services certified by the Council
6 on Law Enforcement Education and Training shall be entitled to
7 receive, upon retirement by reason of length of service, the
8 continued custody and possession of the sidearm and badge carried by
9 such investigator or agent immediately prior to retirement.

10 B. An officer, investigator, or agent specified in subsection A
11 of this section may be entitled to receive, upon retirement by
12 reason of disability, the continued custody and possession of the
13 sidearm and badge carried by such officer or agent immediately prior
14 to retirement upon written approval of the applicable Director of
15 the appropriate Bureau, Department, Commission, or district
16 attorney.

17 C. Custody and possession of the sidearm and badge of an
18 officer, investigator, or agent who dies while employed by any
19 Bureau, Department, Commission, or office specified in subsection A
20 of this section may be awarded by the applicable Director of the
21 appropriate Bureau, Department, Commission, or office to the spouse
22 or ~~next of kin~~ next of kin of the deceased officer, investigator, or
23 agent.

17 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2001, Section 150.23, as

19 2009, Section 150.23), is amended to read as follows:

20 Section 150.23 A. An officer, investigator, or agent of the
21 Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation, the Oklahoma State Bureau of
22 Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control, the Department of Wildlife
23 Conservation, the Law Enforcement Division of the Oklahoma Horse
24 Racing Commission, the State Fire Marshal's Office, the Oklahoma
Tourism and Recreation Department, or the office of a district

1 attorney shall be entitled to receive, upon retirement by reason of
2 length of service, the continued custody and possession of the
3 sidearm and badge carried by such officer, investigator, or agent
4 immediately prior to retirement. In addition, investigators or
5 agents of the Department of Human Services certified by the Council
6 on Law Enforcement Education and Training shall be entitled to
7 receive, upon retirement by reason of length of service, the
8 continued custody and possession of the sidearm and badge carried by
9 such investigator or agent immediately prior to retirement.

10 B. An officer, investigator, or agent specified in subsection A
11 of this section may be entitled to receive, upon retirement by
12 reason of disability, the continued custody and possession of the
13 sidearm and badge carried by such officer or agent immediately prior
14 to retirement upon written approval of the applicable Director of
15 the appropriate Bureau, Department, Commission, or district
16 attorney.

17 C. Custody and possession of the sidearm and badge of an
18 officer, investigator, or agent who dies while employed by any
19 Bureau, Department, Commission, or office specified in subsection A
20 of this section may be awarded by the applicable Director of the
21 appropriate Bureau, Department, Commission, or office to the spouse
22 or ~~next of kin~~ next of kin of the deceased officer, investigator, or
23 agent.
