7 COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

8 An Act relating to the Oklahoma Music Trail; enacting  
9 the Oklahoma Music Trail Act of 2010; making  
10 designation for purposes of planning and  
11 administration; requiring specific executive agencies  
12 to work in cooperation; designating entities and  
13 certain appointments as working group; requiring  
14 certain input and assistance; providing for coalition  
15 of scholars; requiring creation of map and brochures;  
16 providing for marketing and advertising; providing  
17 for selection of sites based upon persons and places;  
18 providing for system of markers; providing for  
19 features of markers; providing for codification; and  
20 providing an effective date.

21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

22 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
23 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1891.1 of Title 74, unless there  
24 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma Music  
Trail Act of 2010".

1 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
2 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1891.2 of Title 74, unless there  
3 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

4 The Oklahoma Music Hall of Fame and Museum is hereby designated  
5 as the entity responsible for planning and providing administration  
6 for the Oklahoma Music Trail.

7 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
8 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1891.3 of Title 74, unless there  
9 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

10 The Oklahoma Music Hall of Fame and Museum, the Oklahoma Tourism  
11 and Recreation Department, the Oklahoma Historical Society, the  
12 Oklahoma Film and Music Commission and the Oklahoma Department of  
13 Transportation shall work in a cooperative partnership to establish,  
14 maintain and promote the Oklahoma Music Trail. A representative of  
15 each of the entities identified in this section plus a  
16 representative appointed by the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of  
17 Representatives and a representative appointed by the President Pro  
18 Tempore of the Oklahoma State Senate shall be collectively referred  
19 to as the Oklahoma Music Trail working group.

20 SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
21 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1891.4 of Title 74, unless there  
22 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

1           A. The members of the working group shall seek input and  
2 assistance from music-related museums both within and without the  
3 State of Oklahoma to develop the Oklahoma Music Trail system.

4           B. The working group shall promote the formation of a  
5 distinguished coalition of music historians and scholars to develop  
6 an inventory of the most notable musical sites to feature and  
7 highlight as part of the Oklahoma Music Trail.

8           C. The working group shall be responsible for creating a  
9 detailed "Oklahoma Music Trail" map and brochure to promote the  
10 history, heritage, legends and folklore that characterize Oklahoma's  
11 musical heritage and the musical heritage of the United States.

12           D. The working group shall be responsible for the marketing and  
13 advertising of the "Oklahoma Music Trail" both within and without  
14 the state as well as internationally through the use of a website,  
15 press releases, and the publicists of the various musical artists  
16 being honored or selected for a dedicated marker along the Oklahoma  
17 Music Trail.

18           SECTION 5.           NEW LAW           A new section of law to be codified  
19 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1891.5 of Title 74, unless there  
20 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

21           A. The Oklahoma Music Trail shall consist of a number of  
22 specific site locations, to be selected by agreement of the working  
23 group, highlighting the lives, careers and musical achievements of  
24

1 musicians born in the state or who spent a substantial or  
2 significant part of their musical career in the state.

3 B. The Oklahoma Music Trail shall also consist of a number of  
4 specific site locations, to be selected by agreement of the working  
5 group, identifying places of significance with respect to Oklahoma's  
6 musical heritage, including, but not limited to, residences,  
7 commercial buildings or other structures.

8 C. Each site along the Oklahoma Music Trail may be designated  
9 with a marker, the design of which shall be selected by agreement of  
10 the working group with final approval by the Oklahoma Music Hall of  
11 Fame and Museum, memorializing the person, place or event selected  
12 for inclusion along the Trail.

13 D. The markers may include such features as the working group  
14 deems to be in the best interest of promoting public interest in and  
15 support of the Oklahoma Music Trail.

16 SECTION 6. This act shall become effective November 1, 2010.
