10 An Act relating to public finance; amending Section
11 1, Chapter 340, O.S.L. 2008, as amended by Section 6,
12 Chapter 451, O.S.L. 2009 (62 O.S. Supp. 2009, Section
13 41.5a-4), which relates to the Information Services
14 Division of the Office of State Finance; clarifying
15 type of electronic storage for removal; specifying
16 type of electronic storage media eligible for certain
17 funds; and declaring an emergency.

18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

19 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 1, Chapter 340, O.S.L.
20 2008, as amended by Section 6, Chapter 451, O.S.L. 2009 (62 O.S.
21 Supp. 2009, Section 41.5a-4), is amended to read as follows:

22 Section 41.5a-4 A. The Information Services Division of the
23 Office of State Finance is authorized to:

24 1. Develop and publish a state policy and procedures for the
destruction or disposal of all electronic storage media to ensure

1 that all confidential information stored on such electronic media
2 devices is destroyed or disposed of in a secure and safe manner;

3 2. Define the requirements for the secure destruction or
4 disposal of electronic storage media; and

5 3. Assist the Department of Central Services in implementing
6 the policy and procedures for the destruction or disposal of state
7 electronic storage media.

8 B. The Information Services Division of the Office of State
9 Finance shall notify all agencies, boards, commissions and
10 authorities of the policy and procedures for the secure and safe
11 destruction or disposal of electronic storage media.

12 C. The Department of Central Services shall remove all data
13 from electronic storage media from all surplus information
14 technology and telecommunication equipment before it is sold,
15 donated, stored or destroyed. A state agency may remove electronic
16 storage media from their surplus information technology and
17 telecommunication equipment prior to sending the surplus to the
18 Department of Central Services, so long as the agency has the
19 technical expertise for removal and that the electronic storage
20 media is sent for destruction or disposal pursuant to this
21 subsection.

22 D. The Department of Central Services shall use existing and
23 future funds from the sale of state surplus equipment and
24 appropriations, as necessary, to pay for the destruction of

1 electronic storage media of equipment processed through the
2 Department of Central Services.

3 SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
4 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
5 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
6 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
