10	An Act relating to autism; defining terms; providing for the licensing of certain persons; stating
11	qualifications; providing for renewal; stating duties of licensee; prohibiting certain act; providing
12	penalties; stating duties of the Developmental Disabilities Services Division of the Department of
13	Human Services; exempting certain persons; providing for the promulgation of rules; directing funds to be
14	used for certain purpose; authorizing the State Department of Health to contract with third parties
15	for certain services; directing funds for certain evaluation training; providing for a behavior
16	analysis treatment pilot project; stating requirements; requiring commencement of project by
17	certain date; limiting duration of project; providing for certain report to the Legislature and Governor;
18	directing the University Hospitals Authority to establish certain program; stating certain condition
19	for location; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.
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22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
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1	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
2	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1928 of Title 59, unless there
3	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
4	A. As used in this act:
5	1. a. "Applied behavior analysis" means the design,
6	implementation, and evaluation of instructional and
7	environmental modifications to produce socially
8	significant improvements in human behavior through
9	skill, acquisition, and the reduction of problematic
10	behavior. An applied behavior analysis program shall:
11	(1) be based on empirical research including the
12	direct observation and measurement of behavior as
13	well as a functional behavior assessment, and
14	(2) utilize antecedent stimuli, positive
15	reinforcement, and other consequences to produce
16	behavior change.
17	b. Applied behavior analysis does not include cognitive
18	therapies or psychological testing, neuropsychology,
19	psychotherapy, sex therapy, psychoanalysis,
20	hypnotherapy, and long-term counseling as treatment
21	modalities;
22	2. "Board" means the nationally accredited Behavior Analyst
23	Certification Board;
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1 3. "Human services professional" means an individual licensed 2 or certified by the state as one of the following: a licensed physical therapist or physical therapist 3 a. assistant pursuant to Sections 887.1 through 887.18 of 4 5 Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes, an occupational therapist, occupational therapy b. 6 assistant, or occupational therapy aide pursuant to 7 Sections 888.1 through 888.15 of Title 59 of the 8 9 Oklahoma Statutes, a licensed clinical social worker, licensed masters 10 c. social worker, or social work associate pursuant to 11 Sections 1250 through 1273 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma 12 Statutes, 13 d. a psychologist or health service psychologist pursuant 14 to Sections 1351 through 1376 of Title 59 of the 15 Oklahoma Statutes, 16 a licensed speech pathologist, licensed audiologist, 17 e. speech-language pathologist or audiologist pursuant to 18 Sections 1601 through 1622 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma 19 Statutes, 20 f. a licensed professional counselor or licensed 21 professional counselor candidate pursuant to Sections 2.2 1901 through 1920 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma 23 24 Statutes,

- 1g. a licensed marital and family therapist or licensed2marital and family therapist candidate pursuant to3Sections 1925.1 through 1925.18 of Title 59 of the4Oklahoma Statutes, or
- h. a licensed behavioral practitioner or licensed
 behavioral practitioner candidate pursuant to Sections
 1930 through 1949.1 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma
 Statutes;

9 4. "Certified assistant behavior analyst" means an individual
10 who is certified by the nationally accredited Behavior Analyst
11 Certification Board as a Board-Certified Assistant Behavior Analyst
12 and certified by the Developmental Disabilities Services Division of
13 the Department of Human Services;

14 5. "Licensed behavior analyst" means an individual who is
15 certified by the nationally accredited Behavior Analyst
16 Certification Board as a Board-Certified Behavior Analyst and
17 licensed by the Developmental Disabilities Services Division of the
18 Department; and

Supervisee" means a person who acts under the extended
 authority of a licensed behavior analyst to provide applied behavior
 analysis services or a person who is in training to provide such
 services.

B. Each person wishing to practice as a licensed behavior
analyst or a certified assistant behavior analyst shall apply to the

Developmental Disabilities Services Division of the Department of
 Human Services using a form and in a manner prescribed by the
 Division and shall furnish evidence satisfactory to the Division
 that such person:

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1. Is of good moral character;

2. Is at least twenty-one (21) years of age;

7 3. Has passed the Board examination and is certified by the
8 Board as a Board-Certified Behavior Analyst or a Board-Certified
9 Assistant Behavior Analyst, as applicable;

4. Has not had a professional license or certification refused,
revoked, suspended, or restricted and does not have a complaint,
allegation, or investigation pending in any regulatory jurisdiction
in the United States or in another country for reasons that relate
to unprofessional conduct unless the Division finds, to its
satisfaction, that the conduct has been corrected or that mitigating
circumstances exist that prevent its resolution; and

17 5. Has at least the minimum graduate or undergraduate degree,
18 appropriate for the level of certification, from an accredited
19 institution of higher learning in a qualifying field of study, as
20 determined by the Board.

C. A person holding a state license or state certification
shall apply for renewal of the state license or state certification
on or before April 30 of each odd-numbered year. The application

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shall be accompanied by a renewal fee to be set by the Division in
 accordance with paragraph 3 of subsection F of this section.

D. A person licensed or certified by the Developmental
Disabilities Services Division of the Department under this section
shall:

Maintain active status and fulfill all requirements for
renewal of national certification or recertification with the Board;
and

9 2. Conduct professional activities in accordance with accepted
10 standards such as the Guidelines for Responsible Conduct and
11 Professional Disciplinary Standards of the Board.

1. No person shall claim the title of licensed behavior 12 Ε. analyst or certified assistant behavior analyst unless that person 13 meets the applicable requirements in this section. No person shall 14 practice applied behavior analysis without obtaining a license or 15 certification in accordance with this section. Supervisees may only 16 provide applied behavior analysis under the supervision of a 17 licensed behavior analyst. This section shall not restrict the 18 practice of applied behavior analysis by human services 19 professionals, provided such individuals are working within the 20 scope of their professions and the practice of applied behavior 21 analysis is commensurate with their level of training and 2.2 experience. 23

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1 2. A violation of this subsection shall be punishable by a fine of not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), the suspension or 2 revocation of a license or certification issued pursuant to this 3 section, or both such fine and loss of licensure or certification. 4 5 F. The Division shall: Investigate all complaints relating to: 6 1. the practice or supervision of applied behavior 7 a. analysis by any person licensed by the Developmental 8 Disabilities Services Division of the Department as a 9 10 behavior analyst or certified by the Division as an assistant behavior analyst, or 11 12 b. any person alleged to be practicing or providing supervision without a state license or state 13 certification; 14 Refer any substantiated complaints to the Board; and 15 2. Charge reasonable fees for a license or for certification, 16 3. not to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00). 17 A person having a gualifying degree, as provided for in 18 G. 1. paragraph 5 of subsection B of this section, and participating in 19 the applied behavior analysis treatment pilot project established in 20 Section 3 of this act shall be exempt from the requirements of this 21 section while such person is actively participating in the project. 22 Persons employed by a school district in this state who 2. 23 provide services solely to the school district under the Individuals 24

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with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), 20 U.S.C., Section 1400 et
 seq., shall be exempt from the requirements of this section.

3 H. The Department shall promulgate rules to implement the4 provisions of this section.

5 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 6 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-280.1 of Title 63, unless 7 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. Funds shall be used by the State Department of Education for
9 specialized training for direct service providers in the Sooner
10 Start program to acquire skills necessary to treat children with
11 autism spectrum disorders.

B. The State Department of Health is authorized to contract
with independent third-party providers for services offered by the
Sooner Start program.

15 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 16 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-280.2 of Title 63, unless 17 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. Funds shall be used by the University Hospitals Authority
for primary care provider evaluation training for providers in the
Sooner SUCCESS program to acquire skills necessary to evaluate
children with autism spectrum disorders.

B. 1. The Developmental Disabilities Services Division of the
Department of Human Services shall establish an applied behavior

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analysis treatment pilot project. The Division shall secure federal
 matching dollars to implement and maintain the project.

2. The project shall:

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- a. provide three Board-Certified Behavior Analysts to
 measure functional outcomes of children with autism,
 who are approved by the Division to participate in the
 project, and study the effects of applied behavior
 analysis in a consultative model that includes a
 parental training component, and
- b. require the participating analysts to provide the
 necessary supervision to assist supervisees in this
 state to learn and provide applied behavior analysis
 and achieve certification by the nationally accredited
 Behavior Analyst Certification Board.

3. The project shall commence no later than January 1, 2011,
and end no later than three (3) years from the date of commencement.
4. The Division shall submit a report to the Legislature and
the Governor no later than January 1, 2014, concerning:

a. the effectiveness of the project,

20 b. the results found when using applied behavior analysis 21 in a consultative model that includes a parental 22 training component to measure functional outcomes of 23 children with autism,

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1	c. the most effective approach and systems to provide
2	applied behavior analysis, and
3	d. any other findings and recommendations resulting from
4	the project.
5	5. The Department shall promulgate rules to implement the
6	provisions of this subsection.
7	SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
8	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-280.3 of Title 63, unless
9	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
10	The University Hospitals Authority shall establish a program
11	modeled after Early Foundations, an outreach program that provides
12	early intensive behavioral intervention for children with autism.
13	The program shall be established in a county selected by the
14	University Hospitals Authority where an Early Foundations program
15	does not exist.
16	SECTION 5. This act shall become effective November 1, 2009.
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
