12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

13 SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to the Alcoholic
14 Beverage Laws Enforcement Commission from any monies not otherwise
15 appropriated from the General Revenue Fund of the State Treasury for
16 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010, the sum of _____
17 Dollars (\$0.00) or so much thereof as may be necessary to perform
18 the duties imposed upon the Alcoholic Beverage Laws Enforcement
19 Commission by law.

20 SECTION 2. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010, the
21 Alcoholic Beverage Laws Enforcement Commission shall budget all
22 funds in the following categories and amounts:

6 SECTION 3. The duties and compensation of employees, not
7 otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed
8 upon the Alcoholic Beverage Laws Enforcement Commission by law shall
9 be set by the Director of the Alcoholic Beverage Laws Enforcement
10 Commission. The salary of the Director of the Alcoholic Beverage
11 Laws Enforcement Commission shall not exceed _____ Dollars
12 (\$0.00) per annum, payable monthly for the fiscal year ending June
13 30, 2010. The Alcoholic Beverage Laws Enforcement Commission for
14 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010, shall be subject to the
15 following budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent employees
16 and expenditures excluding expenditures for capital and special
17 projects, except as may be authorized pursuant to the provisions of
18 Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:

22 SECTION 4. Appropriations made by this act, not including
23 appropriations made for capital outlay purposes, may be budgeted for
24 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010 (hereafter FY-10) or may be

1 budgeted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011 (hereafter FY-11).
2 Funds budgeted for FY-10 may be encumbered only through June 30,
3 2010, and must be expended by November 15, 2010. Any funds
4 remaining after November 15, 2010, and not budgeted for FY-11, shall
5 lapse to the credit of the proper fund for the then current fiscal
6 year. Funds budgeted for FY-11 may be encumbered only through June
7 30, 2011. Any funds remaining after November 15, 2011, shall lapse
8 to the credit of the proper fund for the then current fiscal year.
9 These appropriations may not be budgeted in both fiscal years
10 simultaneously. Funds budgeted in FY-10, and not required to pay
11 obligations for that fiscal year, may be budgeted for FY-11, after
12 the agency to which the funds have been appropriated has prepared
13 and submitted a budget work program revision removing these funds
14 from the FY-10 budget work program and after such revision has been
15 approved by the Office of State Finance.

16 SECTION 5. This act shall become effective July 1, 2009.

17 SECTION 6. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
18 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
19 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
20 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
