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7 An Act relating to the militia; authorizing Adjutant
8 General to receive certain donated or appropriated
9 funds; authorizing the expenditure of certain funds
10 for certain purposes; amending 44 O.S. 2001, Section
11 232.7, as amended by Section 5, Chapter 254, O.S.L.
12 2006 (44 O.S. Supp. 2009, Section 232.7), which
13 relates to the management of armory board funds;
14 providing authority for Adjutant General to expend
15 certain funds for furnishings; adding certain
16 facilities to locations under board control;
17 providing for codification; and declaring an
18 emergency.

19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

20 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
21 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 26.1 of Title 44, unless there
22 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

23 The Adjutant General may receive financial donations and expend
24 such donated funds or utilize state appropriated funds for mementos,
presentations or participation in events designed to promote the
interests and relationships of the Military Department or Oklahoma
National Guard, specifically, but not limited to, the State
Partnership Program. A full and complete record of such donated

1 funds received and disbursed by the Military Department shall be
2 kept and shall be subject to audit, and reports submitted to the
3 Adjutant General upon request. Such expenditures shall be limited
4 to Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) per occasion and shall not exceed
5 Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00) per year.

6 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 44 O.S. 2001, Section 232.7, as
7 amended by Section 5, Chapter 254, O.S.L. 2006 (44 O.S. Supp. 2009,
8 Section 232.7), is amended to read as follows:

9 Section 232.7 Armory board funds shall be controlled,
10 deposited, expended and accounted for at the direction of the
11 Adjutant General. A full and complete record of funds received and
12 disbursed by the armory board shall be kept and shall be subject to
13 audit, and reports submitted to the Adjutant General upon request.
14 The Adjutant General may expend armory board revenue received for
15 the improvement, including street improvement, alterations,
16 furnishings, repair and maintenance of the armory and facilities
17 under its control and may further expend such funds for the benefit
18 of state military organizations assigned thereto. If such funds are
19 not needed for the operation, repair, and maintenance of the armory
20 or facilities or if no military organization is assigned to the
21 armory or facility, the Adjutant General may order such funds to be
22 turned over to the Adjutant General and expend such funds for the
23 benefit of the National Guard of the state as a whole.
