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13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

14 SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to the Oklahoma State  
15 Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control from any monies not  
16 otherwise appropriated from the General Revenue Fund of the State  
17 Treasury for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011, the sum of  
18 \_\_\_\_\_ Dollars (\$0.00) or so much thereof as may be necessary  
19 to perform the duties imposed upon the Oklahoma State Bureau of  
20 Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control by law.

21 SECTION 2. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011, the  
22 Oklahoma State Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control shall  
23 budget all funds in the following categories and amounts:

9       The agency shall develop outcome-based performance measures for  
10 each budget category.

11       SECTION 3. The duties and compensation of employees, not  
12 otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed  
13 upon the Oklahoma State Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs  
14 Control by law shall be set by the Director. The salary of the  
15 Director shall not exceed \_\_\_\_\_ Dollars (\$0.00) per annum,  
16 payable monthly for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011. The  
17 Oklahoma State Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control for  
18 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011, shall be subject to the  
19 following budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent employees  
20 and expenditures excluding expenditures for capital and special  
21 projects, except as may be authorized pursuant to the provisions of  
22 Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:

2 Full-time-equivalent employees solely paid by grant funds shall  
3 not count against the agency's budgetary limitations as specified in  
4 this section.

5 SECTION 4. Of the amount appropriated to the Oklahoma State  
6 Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control by Section 1 of this  
7 act, an amount not to exceed Two Hundred Thousand Dollars  
8 (\$200,000.00) may be transferred to an agency special account  
9 established pursuant to the provisions of Section 7.2 of Title 62 of  
10 the Oklahoma Statutes. Funds in this account are to purchase  
11 controlled dangerous substances to be used as evidence in narcotic  
12 cases, for fees for informers, or employees, and for other expenses  
13 necessary to apprehend and convict violators of state laws  
14 regulating controlled dangerous substances. The Director of the  
15 Oklahoma State Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control and  
16 the Director of State Finance shall promulgate rules for the  
17 expenditure of the funds transferred by this section.

18 SECTION 5. Appropriations made by this act, not including  
19 appropriations made for capital outlay purposes, may be budgeted for  
20 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011 (hereafter FY-11) or may be  
21 budgeted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2012 (hereafter FY-12).  
22 Funds budgeted for FY-11 may be encumbered only through June 30,  
23 2011, and must be expended by November 15, 2011. Any funds  
24 remaining after November 15, 2011, and not budgeted for FY-12, shall

1 lapse to the credit of the proper fund for the then current fiscal  
2 year. Funds budgeted for FY-12 may be encumbered only through June  
3 30, 2012. Any funds remaining after November 15, 2012, shall lapse  
4 to the credit of the proper fund for the then current fiscal year.  
5 These appropriations may not be budgeted in both fiscal years  
6 simultaneously. Funds budgeted in FY-11, and not required to pay  
7 obligations for that fiscal year, may be budgeted for FY-12, after  
8 the agency to which the funds have been appropriated has prepared  
9 and submitted a budget work program revision removing these funds  
10 from the FY-11 budget work program and after such revision has been  
11 approved by the Office of State Finance.

12 SECTION 6. This act shall become effective July 1, 2010.

13 SECTION 7. It being immediately necessary for the preservation  
14 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby  
15 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and  
16 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
