7 An Act relating to the Oklahoma Music Trail; enacting
8 the Oklahoma Music Trail Act of 2010; making
9 designation for purposes of planning and
10 administration; requiring specific executive agencies
11 to work in cooperation; designating entities and
12 certain appointments as working group; requiring
13 certain input and assistance; providing for coalition
14 of scholars; requiring creation of map and brochures;
15 providing for marketing and advertising; providing
16 for selection of sites based upon persons and places;
17 providing for system of markers; providing for
18 features of markers; making implementation contingent
19 upon funding; providing for codification; and
20 providing an effective date.

23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

24 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1891.1 of Title 74, unless there
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma Music
Trail Act of 2010".

SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1891.2 of Title 74, unless there
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

1 The Oklahoma Music Hall of Fame and Museum is hereby designated
2 as the entity responsible for planning and providing administration
3 for the Oklahoma Music Trail.

4 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
5 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1891.3 of Title 74, unless there
6 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

7 The Oklahoma Music Hall of Fame and Museum, the Oklahoma Tourism
8 and Recreation Department, the Oklahoma Historical Society, the
9 Oklahoma Film and Music Commission and the Oklahoma Department of
10 Transportation shall work in a cooperative partnership to establish,
11 maintain and promote the Oklahoma Music Trail. A representative of
12 each of the entities identified in this section plus a
13 representative appointed by the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of
14 Representatives and a representative appointed by the President Pro
15 Tempore of the Oklahoma State Senate shall be collectively referred
16 to as the Oklahoma Music Trail working group.

17 SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
18 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1891.4 of Title 74, unless there
19 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

20 A. The members of the working group shall seek input and
21 assistance from music-related museums both within and without the
22 State of Oklahoma to develop the Oklahoma Music Trail system.

23 B. The working group shall promote the formation of a
24 distinguished coalition of music historians and scholars to develop

1 an inventory of the most notable musical sites to feature and
2 highlight as part of the Oklahoma Music Trail.

3 C. The working group shall be responsible for creating a
4 detailed "Oklahoma Music Trail" map and brochure to promote the
5 history, heritage, legends and folklore that characterize Oklahoma's
6 musical heritage and the musical heritage of the United States.

7 D. The working group shall be responsible for the marketing and
8 advertising of the "Oklahoma Music Trail" both within and without
9 the state as well as internationally through the use of a website,
10 press releases, and the publicists of the various musical artists
11 being honored or selected for a dedicated marker along the Oklahoma
12 Music Trail.

13 SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
14 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1891.5 of Title 74, unless there
15 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

16 A. The Oklahoma Music Trail shall consist of a number of
17 specific site locations, to be selected by agreement of the working
18 group, highlighting the lives, careers and musical achievements of
19 musicians born in the state or who spent a substantial or
20 significant part of their musical career in the state.

21 B. The Oklahoma Music Trail shall also consist of a number of
22 specific site locations, to be selected by agreement of the working
23 group, identifying places of significance with respect to Oklahoma's
24

1 musical heritage, including, but not limited to, residences,
2 commercial buildings or other structures.

3 C. Each site along the Oklahoma Music Trail may be designated
4 with a marker, the design of which shall be selected by agreement of
5 the working group with final approval by the Oklahoma Music Hall of
6 Fame and Museum, memorializing the person, place or event selected
7 for inclusion along the Trail.

8 D. The markers may include such features as the working group
9 deems to be in the best interest of promoting public interest in and
10 support of the Oklahoma Music Trail.

11 SECTION 6. The provisions of this act shall be contingent upon
12 the availability of funding.

13 SECTION 7. This act shall become effective November 1, 2010.
