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1       WHEREAS, 4-H is a community of young people across America who  
2 are learning leadership, citizenship and life skills for one hundred  
3 one (101) years in Oklahoma; and

4       WHEREAS, 4-H is the largest youth organization in Oklahoma,  
5 reaching over one hundred fifty thousand youth between the ages of  
6 five and nineteen through the development of the Head, Heart, Hands  
7 and Health of every member; and

8       WHEREAS, 4-H as part of the Oklahoma Cooperative Extension  
9 Service provided by Langston University and Oklahoma State  
10 University, is a program where youth learn together through various  
11 kinds of projects, events and activities focusing around the mission  
12 mandates addressing Citizenship, Healthy Living, and Science,  
13 Engineering, and Technology (SET); and

14       WHEREAS, when citizens of Oklahoma are mobilized from the  
15 National Guard and reserve components, the children left behind have  
16 unique needs that require extra support and services; and, therefore  
17 members of 4-H through the Operation: Military Kids Initiative and

19 "Month of the Military Child" in recognition of all youths who have
