8 [Supreme Court - budgeting - duties and compensation -
9 effective date]
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11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

12 SECTION 1. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010, the
13 Supreme Court shall budget all funds in the following categories and
14 amounts:

1 SECTION 2. The duties and compensation of employees, not
2 otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed
3 upon the Supreme Court by law shall be set by the Supreme Court
4 Justices by majority vote.

5 SECTION 3. The duties and compensation of employees, not
6 otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed
7 upon the Court of Civil Appeals by law shall be set by the Court of
8 Civil Appeals, subject to the approval of the Supreme Court.

9 SECTION 4. The Supreme Court and the Court of Civil Appeals for
10 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010, shall be subject to the
11 following budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent employees,
12 excluding active retired judges, and expenditures, excluding
13 expenditures for capital and special projects and excluding lawful
14 expenditures from the State Judicial Fund, except as may be
15 authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of
16 the Oklahoma Statutes:
