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11	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
12	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
13	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 7200.1 of Title 63, unless there
14	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
15	This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma Sleep
16	Diagnostic Testing Regulation Act".
17	SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
18	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 7200.2 of Title 63, unless there
19	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
20	The Oklahoma Legislature hereby finds that:
21	1. There is a growing need for sleep diagnostic testing in the
22	diagnosis and treatment of sleep disorders;
23	2. Sleep diagnostic testing is being performed in Oklahoma; and
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3. Oklahoma law does not provide sufficient regulation of sleep diagnostic testing to assure the protection of the public.

Therefore, there is a need to provide legislation to enable the appropriate entities to regulate persons performing sleep diagnostic testing on the citizens of this state.

SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 7200.3 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

As used in the Oklahoma Sleep Diagnostic Testing Regulation Act:

- 1. "Direct supervision" means the supervising physician is present in the sleep diagnostic testing facility and immediately available to furnish assistance and direction throughout the performance of the sleep diagnostic testing. It does not require that the supervising physician be present in the room when the sleep diagnostic testing is performed;
 - 2. a. "Sleep diagnostic testing facility" means a building or place situated in a fixed location or a mobile entity that is used to conduct sleep diagnostic tests. Sleep diagnostic testing facility shall not include a hospital-based facility that is used to conduct sleep diagnostic tests. A facility is hospital-based if:
 - (1) the facility and hospital are subject to the bylaws and operating decisions of a common governing board. This governing board, which has

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1 final administrative responsibility, approves all personnel actions, appoints medical staff, and carries out similar management functions, 3 (2) the facility director or administrator is under 4 5 the supervision of the hospital's chief executive officer and reports through him or her to the 6 7 governing board, (3) the facility personnel policies and practices 9 conform to those of the hospital, the administrative functions of the facility such 10 (4) as records, billing, laundry, housekeeping and 11 purchasing are integrated with those of the 12 13 hospital, and the facility and hospital are financially (5) 14 integrated, as evidenced by the cost report, 15 which reflects allocation of overhead to the 16 facility through the required step-down 17 methodology. 18 b. The following factors are not considered in the 19 determination of whether a facility conducting sleep 20 diagnostic tests is hospital-based: 21 an agreement between a facility and a hospital (1) 2.2 concerning patient referral, 23 24

- 1 (2) a shared service arrangement between a facility
 2 and a hospital, or
 - (3) the physical location of a facility on the premises of a hospital;
 - 3. "General supervision" means the sleep diagnostic testing is furnished under the supervising physician's overall direction and control, but the supervising physician is not necessarily required during the performance of the sleep diagnostic testing;
 - 4. "Interpreting physician" means a physician who determines the meaning of or interprets results of sleep diagnostic tests. An interpreting physician shall be board-certified in sleep medicine by the American Board of Sleep Medicine (ABSM) or the American Board of Medical Specialties or must have completed a one-year sleep medicine fellowship accredited by the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME);
 - 5. "Personal supervision" means a supervising physician is physically present in the sleep diagnostic testing room during the performance of the sleep diagnostic testing;
 - 6. "Physician" means a person licensed to practice:
 - a. allopathic medicine and surgery by the Oklahoma State

 Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision pursuant to

 the Oklahoma Allopathic Medical and Surgical Licensure

 and Supervision Act, or

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- b. osteopathic medicine by the State Board of OsteopathicExaminers pursuant to the Oklahoma OsteopathicMedicine Act;
- 7. "Sleep diagnostic test" means any technological recording procedure used for the diagnosis of sleep related breathing disorders or other disorders of sleep. Sleep diagnostic tests are classified by level of intensity accordingly:
 - a. Level I or Type 1: Attended standard polysomnography

 (PSG) performed in a sleep diagnostic testing

 facility,
 - b. Level II or Type 2: Home sleep test (HST) with type II portable monitor, unattended; minimum of 7 channels:
 EEG, EOG, EMG, ECG/heart rate, airflow, respiratory
 effort and oxygen saturation,
 - c. Level III or Type 3: Home sleep test (HST) with type III portable monitor, unattended; minimum of 4 channels: 2 respiratory movement/airflow, 1 ECG/heart rate and 1 oxygen saturation, and
 - d. Level IV or Type 4: Home sleep test (HST) with type IV portable monitor, unattended; minimum of 3 channels. Sleep diagnostic test shall also mean Multiple Sleep Latency Testing which measures physiologic sleepiness and Maintenance of Wakefulness Testing which measures manifest sleepiness; and

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- 1 "Supervising physician" means a physician responsible for 2 the personal, direct or general supervision of the sleep diagnostic testing performed, including, but not limited to, the quality of the 3 testing performed, the proper operation and calibration of the 4 5 equipment used to perform sleep diagnostic tests and the actions of nonphysician personnel engaged in the performance of the sleep 6 diagnostic testing. A supervising physician shall be board-7 certified in sleep medicine by the American Board of Sleep Medicine 9 (ABSM) or the American Board of Medical Specialties or shall have 10 completed a one-year sleep medicine fellowship accredited by the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME). 11
- SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 7200.4 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
 - A. Sleep diagnostic tests shall be ordered by a physician.
 - B. Sleep diagnostic tests shall be conducted:
 - 1. At a sleep diagnostic testing facility;
 - 2. At a patient's home under the general supervision of a supervising physician and under the direction of nonphysician personnel of sleep diagnostic testing facility; or
 - 3. At a hospital-based facility.
 - C. Sleep diagnostic testing facilities shall meet the following standards:

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- 1. Sleep diagnostic testing facilities shall be under the direction of a supervising physician as defined by this act;
- 2. Sleep diagnostic testing facilities shall be accredited by and comply with the standards set by the American Academy of Sleep Medicine (AASM) or Joint Commission on the Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations (JCAHO) or shall be affiliated through majority ownership or management with a sleep diagnostic testing facility that is accredited by the American Academy of Sleep Medicine (AASM) or Joint Commission on the Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations (JCAHO);
- 3. An interpreting physician as defined by this act shall determine the results of sleep diagnostic tests conducted at a sleep diagnostic testing facility or conducted at a patient's home; and
- 4. Nonphysician personnel conducting sleep diagnostic tests shall practice under the general, direct or personal supervision of the supervising physician.
- SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 7200.5 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. It shall be unlawful for any facility or person to perform sleep diagnostic tests without having first complied with this act or as may otherwise be allowed by applicable law.
- B. The State Department of Health is designated as the official agency of this state for all regulatory activities pertaining to

1	health and safety in performing sleep diagnostic tests and is
2	authorized to promulgate rules to implement the provisions of this
3	act.
4	SECTION 6. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
5	of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
6	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
7	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
