An Act relating to state government personnel;  
providing authorization of full-time-equivalent state  
employees for certain state entities; stating fiscal  
year; providing certain exception under certain  
circumstances; providing for noncodification;  
providing an effective date; and declaring an  
emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be  
codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

A. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011, the maximum number  
of full-time-equivalent employees for each of the following  
agencies, boards, commissions, or departments shall not exceed the  
numbers specified in this section, except as may be authorized  
pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of the  
Oklahoma Statutes.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2010.

SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
