A Concurrent Resolution recognizing the efforts and contributions of 4-H members in the state and proclaiming April 7, 2010, to be 4-H Day at the Capitol.

WHEREAS, 4-H is a community of young people across America who are learning leadership, citizenship and life skills for one hundred one (101) years in Oklahoma; and

WHEREAS, 4-H is the largest youth organization in Oklahoma, reaching over one hundred fifty thousand youth between the ages of five and nineteen through the development of the Head, Heart, Hands and Health of every member; and

WHEREAS, 4-H as part of the Oklahoma Cooperative Extension Service provided by Langston University and Oklahoma State University, is a program where youth learn together through various kinds of projects, events and activities focusing around the mission mandates addressing Citizenship, Healthy Living, and Science, Engineering, and Technology (SET); and

WHEREAS, when citizens of Oklahoma are mobilized from the National Guard and reserve components, the children left behind have unique needs that require extra support and services; and, therefore members of 4-H through the Operation: Military Kids Initiative and the Oklahoma Cooperative Extension Service acknowledge April as "Month of the Military Child" in recognition of all youths who have loved ones who serve in Oklahoma military forces and honor their sacrifices as their loved ones protect freedom.
