An Act relating to public health and safety;
authorizing the Office of the State Medical Examiner
and the Board of Medicolegal Investigation to
relocate the Office of the State Medical Examiner to
certain location; authorizing the Office of the State
Medical Examiner to take steps to effectuate the
relocation; authorizing the University of Central
Oklahoma to take steps to effectuate the relocation;
providing for codification; and declaring an
emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 935.1 of Title 63, unless there
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. The Office of the State Medical Examiner and the Board of
Medicolegal Investigations are authorized to relocate the Office of
the State Medical Examiner to a location immediately adjacent or in
close proximity to the University of Central Oklahoma Forensic
Science Institute.

B. The Office of the State Medical Examiner is authorized to take all necessary steps to effectuate the relocation of the Office of the State Medical Examiner to a location immediately adjacent or in close proximity to the University of Central Oklahoma Forensic Science Institute, including, but not limited to, entering into a lease-purchase agreement.

C. The University of Central Oklahoma is authorized to take all necessary steps to effectuate the relocation of the Office of the State Medical Examiner to a location immediately adjacent or in close proximity to the University of Central Oklahoma Forensic Science Institute, including, but not limited to, constructing a building or buildings and entering into a lease-purchase agreement.

SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
