A Concurrent Resolution recognizing the Oklahoma Forest Heritage Center Museum located in Beavers Bend State Park as the Wood Art Capital of Oklahoma; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, the Oklahoma Forest Heritage Center Museum located in Beavers Bend State Park has hosted wood art exhibits which has established an environment conducive to attracting large numbers of talented woodworking and woodturning artists to the State of Oklahoma; and

WHEREAS, the Oklahoma Forest Heritage Center sustains forest heritage through the implementation of history, education, and wood art and has provided a hands-on art experience and a forum to promote education and information about the art and craft of woodturning to schools in Oklahoma; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 52ND OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

THAT the Oklahoma State Legislature honors the Oklahoma Forest Heritage Center located in Beavers Bend State Park in Broken Bow as the Wood Art Capital of Oklahoma.

THAT the Oklahoma State Legislature authorizes the Oklahoma Forest Heritage Center to proclaim a Master Woodworking Artist of the Year status to a commendable artist in that field.

THAT a copy of this resolution be distributed to the Oklahoma Forest Heritage Center.
