A Resolution commemorating 100 years of RVs;  
designating June 2010 "RV Centennial Celebration  
Month"; encouraging Oklahomans to celebrate by RVing;  
and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, 1910 marks the first year of mass-produced,  
manufactured, motorized campers and camping trailers; and

WHEREAS, one in twelve American households owns a recreational  
vehicle (RV), and over 30 million RV enthusiasts take part in this  
affordable and environmentally friendly form of vacationing; and

WHEREAS, RV vacations allow American families to build stronger  
relationships, explore the great outdoors, and take part in healthy  
activities; and

WHEREAS, this homegrown industry, including RV manufacturers,  
suppliers, dealers, and campgrounds, employs hundreds of thousands  
of Americans in good-paying jobs across all 50 states; and

WHEREAS, RVing offers the freedom, comfort and flexibility to  
see all parts of the United States, from historic landmarks and  
National Parks to local campgrounds and sporting events; and

WHEREAS, the 100th anniversary of the introduction of the RV  
into the American marketplace will be celebrated June 7, 2010, at  
the RV Hall of Fame and Museum in Elkhart, Indiana.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 2ND SESSION  
OF THE 52ND OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:

THAT the Oklahoma State Senate supports and recognizes the goals and ideals of RV Centennial Celebration Month to commemorate 100 years of American enjoyment of recreational vehicles.

THAT the Oklahoma State Senate designates June 2010 "RV Centennial Celebration Month" in the State of Oklahoma.

THAT the Oklahoma State Senate encourages the people of Oklahoma to celebrate this anniversary by taking part in RV vacations.

THAT a copy of this resolution be distributed to Jay Landers, Senior Director, Government Affairs, Recreation Vehicle Industry Association (RVIA).
