A Resolution expressing gratitude to Senator Johnnie  
Crutchfield for his service in the Oklahoma State

WHEREAS, Senator Johnnie Crutchfield is completing his twelfth  
year of service to the citizens of District 14 in the Oklahoma State  
Senate; and

WHEREAS, Johnnie Crutchfield was born February 16, 1947, in  
Denton, Texas. He graduated from Southeastern State College with  
both Bachelor's and Master's degrees and completed post-graduate  
studies at the University of Oklahoma. Johnnie Crutchfield worked  
in the Ardmore public school system for 29 years and also served on  
the Ardmore school board and in municipal office. He is married to  
the former Kipp Dwire, and they have two daughters, Kristi and  
Candice; and

WHEREAS, Johnnie Crutchfield has been a member of the Oklahoma State Senate since 1998. He served in many leadership positions, including as Chair and Cochair of the Senate Appropriations Committee; and

WHEREAS, State Question No. 632, adopted September 18, 1990, and effective January 1, 1991, limits the length of service for a member of the Legislature to a total of twelve years, and as a result, Senator Crutchfield will not be eligible to stand for reelection this year; and

WHEREAS, after having been an educator for three decades, Johnnie Crutchfield became a student of the legislative process. Through all that came his way – budget demands that exceeded revenues by double-digit factors, health challenges, “special projects”, fires, and power-sharing – Johnnie Crutchfield taught and learned in the legislative classroom with a keen eye, a prudent pocketbook, and a compassionate heart.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 52ND OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:
