1        "To comply with the holding in *Van Orden v. Perry*, the Ten  
2 Commandments monument or a separate monument in close spacial  
3 proximity, shall display the figures depicted on the friezes on the  
4 north and south walls of the courtroom of the United States Supreme  
5 Court, including: Menes, the Egyptian who was the originator of the  
6 idea of a centralized government and political system; Hammurabi,  
7 creator of the Code of Hammurabi, which covered all civil and  
8 criminal disputes; Moses, the great Hebrew prophet who received the  
9 Ten Commandments and delivered them to the Hebrew people; Solomon,  
10 king of Israel whose name is synonymous with judicial wisdom;  
11 Lycurgus, the Spartan, who guided the reform of the Spartan  
12 constitution; Solon, the Athenian who codified the laws of the  
13 Greeks and is credited with laying the foundation for the world's  
14 first democracy; Draco, the Athenian who was the first to write an  
15 Athenian code of laws; Confucius, the Chinese lawgiver who taught a  
16 comprehensive system of ideas for government; Octavian, the first  
17 emperor of Rome who gave judges a new authoritative role and the  
18 concept of adherence to precedent; Justinian, the Byzantine emperor  
19 who codified Roman law and published "Corpus Juris Civilis", a  
20 coherent code that became the basis for modern civil law; in place  
21 of the image of Muhammad, a depiction of the Koran, to signify the  
22 fundamental legal tenet of Islam; Charlemagne, the Roman emperor and  
23 king of the Franks, who restored order to the fragmented Roman  
24 Empire during the middle ages; King John of England, who signed the

1 Magna Carta, which elevated the importance of individual rights and  
2 the concept of due process; Louis IX, King of France who instituted  
3 a regular court of justice; Hugo Grotius, the Dutch lawyer who wrote  
4 "De jure belli ac pacis", which is the basis for modern  
5 international law; William Blackstone, author of the "Commentaries  
6 on the Laws of England", which had a major influence on American  
7 law; Napoleon Bonaparte, who gave the world the Napoleonic Code; and  
8 John Marshall, considered the greatest leader of the U.S. Supreme  
9 Court who initiated the idea of judicial review. If a separate  
10 monument is erected, it shall be constructed and placed on the  
11 Capitol grounds within a reasonable time after the placement of the  
12 Ten Commandments monument."
