House Bill No. 1013

COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 1013 - By: WRIGHT of the House.

An Act relating to sunset; amending 59 O.S. 2001, Section 199.2, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 12, O.S.L. 2003 (59 O.S. Supp. 2008, Section 199.2), which relates to the State Board of Cosmetology; re-creating the Board; and modifying termination date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

1 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2001, Section 199.2, as last amended by
2 Section 1, Chapter 12, O.S.L. 2003 (59 O.S. Supp. 2008, Section 199.2), is amended to
3 read as follows:

4 Section 199.2 A. 1. There is hereby re-created, to continue until July 1, ~~2009~~ 2013,
5 in accordance with the provisions of the Oklahoma Sunset Law, a State Board of
6 Cosmetology which shall be composed of nine (9) members to be appointed by the
7 Governor and to serve at the pleasure of the Governor.

8 2. One member shall be appointed from each congressional district and the
9 additional members shall be appointed at large. However, when congressional districts
10 are redrawn each member appointed prior to July 1 of the year in which such
11 modification becomes effective shall complete the current term of office and
12 appointments made after July 1 of the year in which such modification becomes effective

1 shall be based on the redrawn districts. Appointments made after July 1 of the year in
2 which such modification becomes effective shall be from any redrawn districts which are
3 not represented by a board member until such time as each of the modified congressional
4 districts are represented by a board member.

5 3. At the time of appointment, the members shall be citizens of this state, at least
6 twenty-five (25) years of age, and shall be high school graduates. Six members shall, at
7 the time of appointment, have had at least five (5) years' continuous practical experience
8 in the practice of cosmetology in this state, one member shall be a lay person, one
9 member shall be an administrator of a licensed private cosmetology school, and one
10 member shall be an administrator of a public school licensed to teach cosmetology.

11 4. No two members shall be graduates of the same cosmetology school, nor shall
12 they be organizers of or promote the organization of any cosmetic, beauty, or
13 hairdressers' association. Each of the six cosmetology appointees shall continue to be
14 actively engaged in the profession of cosmetology while serving.

15 5. If any member retires or ceases to practice his or her profession during the term
16 of membership on the Board, such terms shall automatically cease and the Governor
17 shall appoint a like-qualified person to fulfill the remainder of the term.

18 B. The terms of office for Board members shall be four (4) years ending June 30.

19 C. Each member shall serve until a successor is appointed and qualified.

20 D. Five members of the Board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of
21 business.

1 E. The Governor may remove any member of the Board at any time at the
2 Governor's discretion. Vacancies shall be filled by appointment by the Governor for the
3 unexpired portion of the term.

4 F. The Board shall organize by electing from its membership a chair and vice-chair,
5 each to serve for a period of one (1) year. The presiding officer shall not be entitled to vote
6 upon any question except in the case of a tie vote.

7 Members shall be reimbursed for their actual and necessary traveling expenses as
8 provided by the State Travel Reimbursement Act.

9 G. Within thirty (30) days after the end of each fiscal year, the Board shall make a
10 full report to the Governor of all its receipts and expenditures, and also a full statement
11 of its work during the year, together with such recommendations as the Board deems
12 expedient.

13 H. The Board may expend funds for suitable office space for the transaction of its
14 business. The Board shall adopt a common seal for the use of the executive director in
15 authenticating Board documents.

16 I. The Board shall meet at its office for the transaction of such business as may
17 come before it on the second Monday in January, March, May, July, September, and
18 November and at such other times as it may deem advisable.
