House Bill No. 1662

HOUSE BILL NO. 1662 - By: DORMAN of the House and SYKES of the Senate.

An Act relating to crimes and punishments; prohibiting the exhibit of certain materials in vehicles; defining terms; providing penalty; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

1 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma
2 Statutes as Section 1040.56 of Title 21, unless there is created a duplication in
3 numbering, reads as follows:

4 A. No material which is harmful to minors shall be exhibited on a television,
5 monitor, or other viewing screen or surface, located within or on a motor vehicle, in any
6 manner visible to other drivers or any person outside the vehicle. As used in this
7 subsection, "material" and "harmful to minors" shall have the same meaning as provided
8 for in Section 1040.75 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

9 B. Any person convicted of violating the provisions of this section shall be guilty of
10 a misdemeanor and subject to a fine of not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00).

11 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2009.
