House Bill No. 2353

HOUSE BILL NO. 2353 - By: MILLER AND MARTIN (SCOTT) of the House and JOHNSON (MIKE) AND MYERS of the Senate.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Health Care Authority; making appropriations to the Oklahoma Health Care Authority; authorizing transfer; stating purpose; requiring budgeting in certain categories and amounts; providing for duties and compensation of employees; limiting salary of the Administrator; authorizing payment of certain expenses; authorizing the employing of certain attorneys; prohibiting certain increases in budgetary limits; providing budgetary limitations; providing procedures for exempting certain funds from expenditure and budgetary limitations; requiring certain filings and approvals; specifying certain funding requirements; authorizing transfers of certain funds; providing procedures; authorizing the expenditure of previously appropriated funds for certain purpose; requiring recordkeeping; authorizing certain requests relating to early transfers; exempting certain funds from fiscal year limitations; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

1 SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to the Oklahoma Health Care Authority
2 from any monies not otherwise appropriated from the General Revenue Fund of the State
3 Treasury for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011, the sum of _____ Dollars
4 (\$0.00) or so much thereof as may be necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the
5 Oklahoma Health Care Authority by law.

6 SECTION 2. There is hereby appropriated to the Oklahoma Health Care Authority
7 from any monies not otherwise appropriated from the Tobacco Settlement Fund of the

1 State Treasury for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011, the sum of _____ Dollars
2 (\$0.00) or so much thereof as may be necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the
3 Oklahoma Health Care Authority by law.

4 SECTION 3. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority is hereby authorized to transfer
5 from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act Fund (“490”) to the CMIA Programs
6 Disbursing Fund (“340”) of the Oklahoma Health Care Authority, the sum of
7 _____ Dollars (\$0.00) or so much as may be necessary to perform the duties
8 imposed on the Oklahoma Health Care Authority by law.

9 SECTION 4. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011, the Oklahoma Health Care
10 Authority shall budget all funds in the following categories and amounts:

21 SECTION 5. A. The duties and compensation of employees, not otherwise
22 prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the Oklahoma Health

1 Care Authority by law shall be set by the Administrator of the Oklahoma Health Care
2 Authority.

3 B. The salary of the Administrator shall not exceed _____ Dollars (\$0.00)
4 per annum, payable monthly for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011.

5 C. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority is authorized to:

6 1. Pay professional expenses of the Administrator of the Authority, including dues,
7 licenses, professional memberships, continuing medical education classes conducted in
8 the State of Oklahoma, and medical malpractice insurance;

9 2. Pay professional expenses of any Oklahoma licensed physician, including dues,
10 licenses, professional memberships, continuing medical education classes conducted in
11 the State of Oklahoma, and medical malpractice insurance, provided the physician is a
12 full-time employee of the Authority in accordance with subsection B of Section 5006 of
13 Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes or paragraph 1 of subsection B of Section 840-5.5 of
14 Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes and utilizing those professional skills in the
15 performance of their job duties; and

16 3. Employ six (6) full-time-equivalent attorneys. This authorization shall not
17 increase the budgetary limits in this section.

18 D. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011,
19 shall be subject to the following budgetary limitations, except as may be authorized
20 pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:

21 Full-time-equivalent Employees	0.0

1 Lease-Purchase Agreements \$0.00

2 Full-time equivalent employees solely paid by grant funds will not count against the
3 agency's budgetary limitations as specified in this section.

4 Twenty (20.0) full-time-equivalent employees solely paid by the Health Employee
5 and Economy Improvement Act (HEEIA) Revolving Fund ("245") will not count against
6 the agency's budgetary limitations as specified in this section.

7 SECTION 6. A. The Administrator of the Oklahoma Health Care Authority may
8 request in the manner provided in this section that receipt and expenditure of
9 unanticipated federal funds awarded after July 1, 2010, be exempt from expenditure
10 limitations and from budgetary limitations.

11 1. The Administrator shall make a request for exemption to the Director of State
12 Finance in writing and file a revised budget program.

13 2. The Administrator shall also file copies of the request for exemption and budget
14 work program revisions with the Oklahoma House of Representatives Appropriations
15 and Budget Committee Chair and the Oklahoma State Senate Appropriations Committee
16 Chair. The Oklahoma House of Representatives Appropriations and Budget Committee
17 Chair and/or the Oklahoma State Senate Appropriations Committee Chair shall notify
18 the Director of State Finance of any noncompliance of the request with legislative intent
19 within twelve (12) calendar days of their receipt of the exemption request.

20 B. The Director of State Finance shall approve the request for exemption unless
21 both the Chair and Vice Chair of the Joint Legislative Committee on Budget and
22 Program Oversight provide written notification to the Director of State Finance within

1 twelve (12) calendar days of the Committee's receipt of the exemption request that the
2 exemption subverts the intention and objectives of the Legislature in establishing the
3 original limit. The Director of State Finance shall give written notice of approval or
4 disapproval of each exemption to the agency, the Governor and the Chair of the
5 Oklahoma House of Representatives Appropriations and Budget Committee and the
6 Chair of the Oklahoma State Senate Appropriations Committee within eighteen (18)
7 calendar days of receiving the request.

8 SECTION 7. The Director of State Finance shall transfer monies appropriated from
9 the General Revenue Fund to the Oklahoma Health Care Authority disbursing funds in
10 the amounts and ratios requested by the Authority except that the cumulative amount
11 transferred shall not exceed the cumulative amount of equal monthly allotments of the
12 appropriation from the General Revenue Fund. Monies appropriated or collected for the
13 fiscal year ending June 30, 2011, may be transferred to these disbursing funds for the
14 fiscal year ending June 30, 2010, to satisfy encumbrances and obligations of said fiscal
15 year; provided, that monies equal in amount are transferred from appropriations or
16 collections for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010, to the disbursing fund for the fiscal
17 year ending June 30, 2011, to satisfy encumbrances and obligations of said fiscal year.
18 All transfer requests shall be in writing to the Director of State Finance. The Oklahoma
19 Health Care Authority shall maintain record of the inter-year transfers.

20 SECTION 8. The Director of the Oklahoma Health Care Authority may request
21 through the Director of State Finance the early transfer by the Oklahoma Tax

1 Commission of tax collections to the General Revenue Fund for the purpose of early
2 allocation to the agency's disbursing funds to alleviate cash-flow problems.

3 SECTION 9. The appropriations made by Sections 1 and 2 of this act shall not be
4 subject to fiscal year limitations and shall be available for encumbrance and expenditure
5 purposes for a period of thirty (30) months from the effective date of this act.

6 SECTION 10. The transfer authorized by Section 3 of this act shall not be subject
7 to fiscal year limitations and shall be available for encumbrance and expenditure
8 purposes for a period of thirty (30) months from the effective date of this act.

9 SECTION 11. This act shall become effective July 1, 2010.

10 SECTION 12. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public
11 peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof
12 this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

13 DIRECT TO CALENDAR.
