9 AS INTRODUCED

10 An Act relating to the Oklahoma Merit Protection  
11 Commission; making an appropriation; stating purpose;  
12 requiring budgeting in certain categories and  
13 amounts; providing for duties and compensation of  
14 employees; limiting the salary of the Executive  
15 Director; providing budgetary limitations; providing  
16 lapse dates; requiring certain budget procedures;  
17 providing an effective date; and declaring an  
18 emergency.

19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

20 SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to the Oklahoma Merit  
21 Protection Commission from any monies not otherwise appropriated  
22 from the General Revenue Fund of the State Treasury for the fiscal  
23 year ending June 30, 2011, the sum of \_\_\_\_\_ Dollars (\$0.00) or so  
24 much thereof as may be necessary to perform the duties imposed upon  
25 the Merit Protection Commission by law.

SECTION 2. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011, the Merit Protection Commission shall budget all funds in the following categories and amounts:

SECTION 3. The duties and compensation of employees, not otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the Merit Protection Commission by law shall be set by the Executive Director. The salary of the Executive Director of the Merit Protection Commission shall not exceed \_\_\_\_\_ Dollars (\$0.00) per annum, payable monthly for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011. The Merit Protection Commission for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011, shall be subject to the following budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent employees and expenditures excluding expenditures for capital and special projects, except as may be authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:

2 SECTION 4. Appropriations made by this act, not including  
3 appropriations made for capital outlay purposes, may be budgeted for  
4 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011 (hereafter FY-11) or may be  
5 budgeted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2012 (hereafter FY-12).  
6 Funds budgeted for FY-11 may be encumbered only through June 30,  
7 2011, and must be expended by November 15, 2011. Any funds  
8 remaining after November 15, 2011, and not budgeted for FY-12, shall  
9 lapse to the credit of the proper fund for the then current fiscal  
10 year. Funds budgeted for FY-12 may be encumbered only through June  
11 30, 2012. Any funds remaining after November 15, 2012, shall lapse  
12 to the credit of the proper fund for the then current fiscal year.  
13 These appropriations may not be budgeted in both fiscal years  
14 simultaneously. Funds budgeted in FY-11, and not required to pay  
15 obligations for that fiscal year, may be budgeted for FY-12, after  
16 the agency to which the funds have been appropriated has prepared  
17 and submitted a budget work program revision removing these funds  
18 from the FY-11 budget work program and after such revision has been  
19 approved by the Office of State Finance.

20 SECTION 5. This act shall become effective July 1, 2010.

21 SECTION 6. It being immediately necessary for the preservation  
22 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby  
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1 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and  
2 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
