9 AS INTRODUCED

10 An Act relating to the Department of Mines; making an  
11 appropriation; stating purpose; providing for duties  
12 and compensation of employees; limiting salary of the  
13 Director; providing budgetary limitations; providing  
lapse dates; requiring certain budget procedures;  
prohibiting certain budget procedures; providing an  
effective date; and declaring an emergency.

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16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

17 SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to the Department of  
18 Mines from any monies not otherwise appropriated from the General  
19 Revenue Fund of the State Treasury for the fiscal year ending June  
20 30, 2011, the sum of \_\_\_\_\_ Dollars (\$0.00) or so much thereof  
21 as may be necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the  
22 Department of Mines by law.

1 SECTION 2. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011, the  
2 Department of Mines shall budget all funds in the following  
3 categories and amounts:

9 SECTION 3. The duties and compensation of employees, not  
10 otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed  
11 upon the Department of Mines by law shall be set by the Executive  
12 Director of the Department of Mines. The salary of the Executive  
13 Director of the Department of Mines shall not exceed \_\_\_\_\_  
14 Dollars (\$0.00) per annum, payable monthly for the fiscal year  
15 ending June 30, 2011. The Department of Mines for the fiscal year  
16 ending June 30, 2011, shall be subject to the following budgetary  
17 limitations on full-time-equivalent employees and expenditures  
18 excluding expenditures for capital and special projects, except as  
19 may be authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of  
20 Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:

1       SECTION 4. Appropriations made by this act, not including  
2 appropriations made for capital outlay purposes, may be budgeted for  
3 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011 (hereafter FY-11) or may be  
4 budgeted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2012 (hereafter FY-12).  
5 Funds budgeted for FY-11 may be encumbered only through June 30,  
6 2011, and must be expended by November 15, 2011. Any funds  
7 remaining after November 15, 2011, and not budgeted for FY-12, shall  
8 lapse to the credit of the proper fund for the then current fiscal  
9 year. Funds budgeted for FY-12 may be encumbered only through June  
10 30, 2012. Any funds remaining after November 15, 2012, shall lapse  
11 to the credit of the proper fund for the then current fiscal year.  
12 These appropriations may not be budgeted in both fiscal years  
13 simultaneously. Funds budgeted in FY-11, and not required to pay  
14 obligations for that fiscal year, may be budgeted for FY-12, after  
15 the agency to which the funds have been appropriated has prepared  
16 and submitted a budget work program revision removing these funds  
17 from the FY-11 budget work program and after such revision has been  
18 approved by the Office of State Finance.

19       SECTION 5. This act shall become effective July 1, 2010.

20       SECTION 6. It being immediately necessary for the preservation  
21 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby  
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1 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and  
2 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
