ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 1020 - By: NICHOLS, GUMM AND LEFTWICH of the Senate and TERRILL, COOKSEY AND MCCULLOUGH of the House.

(crimes and punishments - transmission of child pornography - codification -
effective date -
emergency)

1 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma
2 Statutes as Section 1040.8A of Title 21, unless there is created a duplication in
3 numbering, reads as follows:
4 No person shall knowingly transmit child pornography by use of the Internet or by
5 any electronic, photo-electronic or photo-optical system, including, but not limited to,
6 transmission by wire, cable or wireless means. The person transmitting child
7 pornography may be indicted and tried in any county from which such material is sent,
8 or in which it is received. Any person who violates any provision of this section, upon
9 conviction, shall be guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment in the custody of the
10 Department of Corrections for a term of not less than five (5) years nor more than life, or
11 by a fine in an amount not exceeding Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00), or by both such
12 fine and imprisonment.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2009.

2 SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public
3 peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof
4 this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
