Senate Bill No. 580

ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 580 - By: BURRAGE of the Senate and COX AND RITZE of the House.

An Act relating to professions and occupations; permitting long-term care pharmacies to maintain emergency electronic medication kits; directing use of electronic medication kits; directing the State Board of Pharmacy to promulgate certain rules; defining terms; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

- 1 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma
2 Statutes as Section 367.8 of Title 59, unless there is created a duplication in numbering,
3 reads as follows:
- 4 A. A long-term care pharmacy may maintain controlled dangerous substances in an
5 emergency electronic medication kit used at a facility. The controlled dangerous
6 substances may be used only for the emergency medication needs of a resident at the
7 facility. A long-term care pharmacy may maintain drugs in an emergency medication kit
8 for any facility.
- 9 B. The State Board of Pharmacy shall promulgate rules relating to emergency
10 medication kits, including, but not limited to:

1 1. The amount and type of controlled dangerous substances that may be
2 maintained in an emergency medication kit;

3 2. Procedures regarding the use of drugs from an emergency medication kit;

4 3. Recordkeeping requirements; and

5 4. Security requirements.

6 C. As used in this section:

7 1. "Facility" means a facility as defined by the Nursing Home Care Act or an
8 assisted living center as defined by the Continuum of Care and Assisted Living Act; and

9 2. "Long-term care pharmacy" means a licensed pharmacy which is not open to the
10 general public and which primarily provides pharmacy services to institutions.

11 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2009.
