1 WHEREAS, the Oklahoma Junior Miss Scholarship Program is held annually to
2 honor the best and brightest high school senior girls in Oklahoma. This statewide
3 scholarship and honors program recognizes, rewards, and encourages excellence while
4 promoting self-esteem among these young women. The 2010 Oklahoma Junior Miss
5 Scholarship Program occurred on Saturday, March 20, 2010, at the Bartlesville
6 Community Center, with five high school senior young women competing from local and
7 at-large programs from across Oklahoma; and

1 WHEREAS, Miss Ali Aufleger, daughter of Howard and Melinda of Stillwater, was
2 selected as 2010 Oklahoma Junior Miss, winning the Spirit, Interview, Talent, and Self-
3 Expression awards, and a total of \$2,200 in cash college scholarships; and

4 WHEREAS, by being selected the 2010 Oklahoma Junior Miss, Miss Aufleger will
5 be involved in community service, speaking and performing engagements around the
6 State of Oklahoma, and presenting the “Be Your Best Self” message of Self-Confidence
7 and Commitment to Oklahoma’s school children; and

8 WHEREAS, by being selected the 2010 Oklahoma Junior Miss, Miss Aufleger is
9 automatically entered in the America’s Junior Miss Scholarship Program to be held June
10 13-26, 2010, in Mobile, Alabama. Miss Aufleger will compete for the national title with
11 49 other high school senior young women, one from each state, in the categories of
12 Fitness, Interview, Self-Expression, Talent, and Scholastics for a Share of \$75,000 in
13 college scholarships.
