5 ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1013 - By: Wright (John), Ritze and Pittman  
6 of the House and Aldridge of the Senate.

7 An Act relating to sunset; amending 59 O.S. 2001, Section  
8 199.2, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 12, O.S.L. 2003  
9 (59 O.S. Supp. 2008, Section 199.2), which relates to the  
10 State Board of Cosmetology; re-creating the Board; and  
11 modifying termination date.

12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

13 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2001, Section 199.2, as  
14 last amended by Section 1, Chapter 12, O.S.L. 2003 (59 O.S. Supp.  
15 2008, Section 199.2), is amended to read as follows:

16 Section 199.2 A. 1. There is hereby re-created, to continue  
17 until July 1, ~~2009~~ 2013, in accordance with the provisions of the  
18 Oklahoma Sunset Law, a State Board of Cosmetology which shall be  
19 composed of nine (9) members to be appointed by the Governor and to  
20 serve at the pleasure of the Governor.

21 2. One member shall be appointed from each congressional  
22 district and the additional members shall be appointed at large.  
23 However, when congressional districts are redrawn each member  
24 appointed prior to July 1 of the year in which such modification  
25 becomes effective shall complete the current term of office and  
26 appointments made after July 1 of the year in which such

1 modification becomes effective shall be based on the redrawn  
2 districts. Appointments made after July 1 of the year in which such  
3 modification becomes effective shall be from any redrawn districts  
4 which are not represented by a board member until such time as each  
5 of the modified congressional districts are represented by a board  
6 member.

7 3. At the time of appointment, the members shall be citizens of  
8 this state, at least twenty-five (25) years of age, and shall be  
9 high school graduates. Six members shall, at the time of  
10 appointment, have had at least five (5) years' continuous practical  
11 experience in the practice of cosmetology in this state, one member  
12 shall be a lay person, one member shall be an administrator of a  
13 licensed private cosmetology school, and one member shall be an  
14 administrator of a public school licensed to teach cosmetology.

15 4. No two members shall be graduates of the same cosmetology  
16 school, nor shall they be organizers of or promote the organization  
17 of any cosmetic, beauty, or hairdressers' association. Each of the  
18 six cosmetology appointees shall continue to be actively engaged in  
19 the profession of cosmetology while serving.

20 5. If any member retires or ceases to practice his or her  
21 profession during the term of membership on the Board, such terms  
22 shall automatically cease and the Governor shall appoint a like-  
23 qualified person to fulfill the remainder of the term.

1           B. The terms of office for Board members shall be four (4)  
2 years ending June 30.

3           C. Each member shall serve until a successor is appointed and  
4 qualified.

5           D. Five members of the Board shall constitute a quorum for the  
6 transaction of business.

7           E. The Governor may remove any member of the Board at any time  
8 at the Governor's discretion. Vacancies shall be filled by  
9 appointment by the Governor for the unexpired portion of the term.

10          F. The Board shall organize by electing from its membership a  
11 chair and vice-chair, each to serve for a period of one (1) year.  
12 The presiding officer shall not be entitled to vote upon any  
13 question except in the case of a tie vote.

14          Members shall be reimbursed for their actual and necessary  
15 traveling expenses as provided by the State Travel Reimbursement  
16 Act.

17          G. Within thirty (30) days after the end of each fiscal year,  
18 the Board shall make a full report to the Governor of all its  
19 receipts and expenditures, and also a full statement of its work  
20 during the year, together with such recommendations as the Board  
21 deems expedient.

22          H. The Board may expend funds for suitable office space for the  
23 transaction of its business. The Board shall adopt a common seal

1 for the use of the executive director in authenticating Board  
2 documents.

3 I. The Board shall meet at its office for the transaction of  
4 such business as may come before it on the second Monday in January,  
5 March, May, July, September, and November and at such other times as  
6 it may deem advisable.
