9 Accountability Act of 2010 - web-based licenses - Oklahoma
10 State Licensing and Permitting Process Consolidation Pilot
11 Initiative - license applications - noncodification -
12 recodification)

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

14 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
15 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

16 This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma
17 Innovation, Efficiency and Accountability Act of 2010".

18 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY Section 5, Chapter 322, O.S.L.
19 2009 (62 O.S. Supp. 2009, Section 41.5p-1), is amended to read as
20 follows:

21 Section 41.5p-1 A. Except as otherwise provided by this
22 section, as of July 1, 2010, each state agency, board, commission or
23 other entity organized within the executive department of state
24 government responsible for licensing or permitting shall utilize the
25 portal system to allow for ~~the~~ a link to a web-based application and
26 renewal application for any license or permit issued by that agency.

1 Access to the online renewal systems shall be featured prominently
2 on the portal system.

3 B. Each entity responsible for licensing or permitting shall
4 make available to the Office of State Finance on a yearly basis a
5 report describing the number of licenses issued, license renewals
6 and permits issued as well as an estimate of the amount of savings
7 incurred by the entity as a result of the online licensing and
8 permitting process.

9 C. The Office of State Finance shall make available to the
10 public a copy of each report submitted in accordance with the
11 requirements of subsection B of this section by placing the report
12 on the website defined in Section 46 of ~~Title 62 of the Oklahoma~~
13 ~~Statutes~~ this title.

14 D. The Director of the Office of State Finance may exempt a
15 specific license or permit from the requirements of this section
16 should he find compelling evidence that the issuance of the license
17 or permit requires the provision of information that cannot be
18 provided through an online licensing or permitting process and when
19 the failure of the applicant to provide the information would create
20 a significant risk to the integrity of the license or permit. The
21 Director of the Office of State Finance shall document any
22 exemptions issued pursuant to the provisions of this subsection and
23 describe the compelling evidence justifying the need for the

1 exemptions in a report to be provided to the Governor, Speaker of
2 the Oklahoma House of Representatives and Speaker Pro Tempore of the
3 State Senate. The exception provided for in this subsection shall
4 not apply to license renewals pursuant to the Oklahoma Vehicle
5 License and Registration Act of Title 47 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

6 E. The State Board of Health may accept an electronic signature
7 in the application process for any license or permit issued by the
8 State Department of Health, provided the use of an electronic
9 signature shall not create a significant risk to the integrity of
10 the license or permit.

11 SECTION 3. RECODIFICATION Section 5, Chapter 322, O.S.L.
12 2009, as amended by Section 2 of this act (62 O.S. Supp. 2009,
13 Section 41.5p-1), shall be recodified as Section 34.24.1 of Title 62
14 of the Oklahoma Statutes, unless there is created a duplication in
15 numbering.
