SENATE BILL NO. 1325 - By: Anderson of the Senate and Enns of the House.

An Act relating to public health and safety; amending 63 O.S. 2001, Section 3131.5, which relates to the **Oklahoma Advance Directive Act**; modifying certain form; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2001, Section 3131.5, is amended to read as follows:

Section 3131.5 A. For persons under the care of a health care agency, a do-not-resuscitate order shall, if issued, be in accordance with the policies and procedures of the health care agency as long as not in conflict with the provisions of the Oklahoma Do-Not-Resuscitate Act.

B. The do-not-resuscitate consent form shall be in substantially the following form:

OKLAHOMA DO-NOT-RESUSCITATE (DNR) CONSENT FORM

I, \_\_\_\_\_, request limited health care as described in this document. If my heart stops beating or if I stop breathing, no medical procedure to restore breathing or heart

1 function will be instituted by any health care provider including,  
2 but not limited to, emergency medical services (EMS) personnel.

3 I understand that this decision will not prevent me from  
4 receiving other health care such as the Heimlich maneuver or oxygen  
5 and other comfort care measures.

6 I understand that I may revoke this consent at any time in one  
7 of the following ways:

8 1. If I am under the care of a health care agency, by making an  
9 oral, written, or other act of communication to a physician or other  
10 health care provider of a health care agency;

11 2. If I am not under the care of a health care agency, by  
12 destroying my do-not-resuscitate form, removing all do-not-  
13 resuscitate identification from my person, and notifying my  
14 attending physician of the revocation;

15 3. If I am incapacitated and under the care of a health care  
16 agency, my representative may revoke the do-not-resuscitate consent  
17 by written notification ~~of~~ to a physician or other health care  
18 provider of the health care agency or by oral notification ~~of~~ to my  
19 attending physician; or

20 4. If I am incapacitated and not under the care of a health  
21 care agency, my representative may revoke the do-not-resuscitate  
22 consent by destroying the do-not-resuscitate form, removing all do-

1 not-resuscitate identification from my person, and notifying my  
2 attending physician of the revocation.

3 I give permission for this information to be given to EMS  
4 personnel, doctors, nurses, and other health care providers. I  
5 hereby state that I am making an informed decision and agree to a  
6 do-not-resuscitate order.

CERTIFICATION OF PHYSICIAN

(This form is to be used by an attending physician only to certify that an incapacitated person without a representative would not have consented to the administration of cardiopulmonary resuscitation in the event of cardiac or respiratory arrest. An attending physician of an incapacitated person without a representative must know by clear and convincing evidence that the incapacitated person, when competent, decided on the basis of information sufficient to constitute informed consent that such person would not have consented to the administration of cardiopulmonary resuscitation in the event of cardiac or respiratory arrest. Clear and convincing evidence for this purpose shall include oral, written, or other acts of communication between the patient, when competent, and family members, health care providers, or others close to the patient with knowledge of the patient's desires.)

8 age or older who are not legatees, devisees or heirs at law.

9 D. It is the intention of the Legislature that the preferred,  
10 but not required, do-not-resuscitate form in Oklahoma shall be the  
11 form set out in subsection B of this section.

12 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2010.
